**MINUTES OF MEETING OF 7TH CENTRAL ADVISORY BOARD ON DISABILITY
15TH DECEMBER 2024**

7th Meeting of the Central Advisory Board was held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister, Dr. Virendra Kumar on 15th December, 2024 at Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi. List of participants is at **Annexure I**.

2. The 7th meeting of Central Advisory Board on disability started with National Anthem followed by lighting of lamp by the dignitaries.

3. Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, Secretary, DEPwD welcomed Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Union Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment cum-Chairperson of the Central Advisory Board. He also welcomed other members of the Board including Hon'ble Ministers from Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, representatives from various Central/ state Ministries/ Departments/ organizations and non-official members.

4.1 In his introductory remarks, Secretary DEPwD appreciated the work done by Central and state ministries in ensuring the implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

4.2 At the outset, Secretary DEPwD informed about the significant increase of footprint of the Department across the country. He expressed his gratitude towards the States for facilitating lands to build CRCs. He highlighted the development of more than 65 Pradhan Mantri Divyasha Kendras (PMDK) by ALIMCO in last one year, through which PwDs can get Aids and Assistive Devices on-the spot under ADIP scheme of the Department. He informed the delegates that ALIMCO is targeting to build more PMDK across the country with a focus on developing products/devices made in India through the support of academic institutes like the Indian Institute of Technology, AIIMS, NITs, etc.

4.3 The Secretary, DEPwD requested the States to explore possibilities to provide space to ALIMCOs in state run hospital with good footfall for building full-fledged PMDK

in the hospital premises to cater to the persons with disabilities visiting the hospitals for disability treatment or certification.

[Action: State Governments]

4.4 He also requested state governments to utilize the database on the Arjun portal of PwDs who received Assistive devices under ADIP scheme. The States may also push their data of PwDs who have been given assistive devices on the Arjun Portal so that duplication of beneficiaries can be avoided. He stressed that the API of the Arjun Portal is open to all States/NGOs etc. to mitigate the duplicity.

[Action- State Governments]

4.5 Further, Secretary emphasised on one of the Agenda points of the CAB, i.e., understanding of the Master Circular on Reservation and Promotion in government establishments / PSE sector. With a request to the members of the CAB to study the document for uniform and effective implementation of the reservation policy of PwBDs., he offered to conduct training of state government officials on implementing the reservation and promotion of PwDs as per the Master circular encompassing CCPD and DoPT guidelines.

[Action- State Governments/ DEPWD]

4.6 Secretary, DEPWD also solicited attention on the new Assessment Guidelines and RPwD (Amendment) Rules 2024 issued by the Department which have simplified the UDID rules like allowing private practitioners on the board of Doctors.

4.7 Secretary also made a special reference to the major cases of Sickle cell disease in Madhya Pradesh and informed the Hon'ble Minister of Madhya Pradesh that permanent certificates are now being issued for Persons with Sickle cell disease which will benefit the tribal population of Madhya Pradesh. Secretary DEPWD even recognised the lack of awareness among doctors about disability assessments and shared that the Department has conducted training of more than 2000 doctors on the new guidelines of assessment of disabilities. Secretary DEPWD also requested states to release funds to

Government Hospitals for hiring private doctors and ensure availability of staff and timely issuing of UDID cards.

4.8 Secretary DEPwD appreciated the progress of states as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court's Order in the Seema Girijalal case where 80% gap w.r.t the implementation of various provisions of the RPwD Act 2016 has been fulfilled by the States.

4.9 Secretary DEPwD mentioned that Under Accessible India Campaign, the process of release of 2nd Instalment being simplified so that funds can be released smoothly to the state governments. Referring to Rajeev Ratouri Case, Secretary DEPwD highlighted the order of Supreme Court to DEPwD for finalising the non-negotiable aspects of accessibility and separate those from the aspirational ones.

4.10 Secretary DEPwD further emphasized the importance of education amongst children with special needs. He referred to the Andhra Pradesh Samagra Shiksha Project under which the deaf and blind students are taught computers from the 1st Grade itself, so that they can easily blend into the mainstream education. He urged CAB members to encourage multilateral collaboration and requested states to send youth with disabilities to utilize the facilities at Centre for Disability Sports, Gwalior for training at a free of cost boarding and lodging.

4.11 Referring to the Divya Kala Melas conducted by DEPwD for enhancing opportunities for Entrepreneurs with Disabilities, Secretary DEPwD referred to various state level festivals like Hornbill festivals of Nagaland that are conducted by state governments and requested state governments to encourage PwD participation in their respective festivals.

[Action: State Governments]

4.12 Secretary DEPwD concluded his address welcoming all delegates and thanking them for their presence.

5. Shri Rajeev Sharma, Joint Secretary, DEPwD and Member Secretary DEPwD made a brief presentation on each of the agenda points for deliberations of the Central Advisory Board. A copy of the presentation is at **Annexure II**. The following agenda items were placed for discussion for the Central Advisory Board:-

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the sixth CAB meeting held on 27.12.2023
2. Action Taken Report on Sixth CAB Recommendations
3. Supreme Court matter: WP (C) 29329 of 2021 Seema Girija Lal vs Union of India

6. Following the presentation, it was open for all CAB members to start the discussion. The gist of submissions made by Members of the Board is as under:

Shri Narayan Singh Kushwaha, Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice and Welfare of Persons with Disability, Government of Madhya Pradesh.

6.1 The Hon'ble Minister highlighted the various programs implemented for the empowerment of PwDs in the state of Madhya Pradesh. The Hon'ble Minister pointed out the establishment of CDS Gwalior stadium that is developed at international standards and provides opportunities for sportspersons with disabilities.

6.2 Referring to the concerned Agenda point of CAB meeting, Hon'ble Minister mentioned that under special recruitment drive by his Ministry, the recruitment of PwDs under 6% reservation is being in all government establishments of the State. The

Accessible India Campaign is also being implemented at various government offices to ensure that the government buildings are accessible to PwDs. In MP, independent State Commissioner for PwDs is also appointed.

6.3 In regard to schemes for PwDs, the Hon'ble Minister mentioned that the MP Govt has started distribution of assistive devices at Block and Taluka levels. Hon'ble Minister also pointed out the work being undertaken for setting up ALIMCO centres in all districts of MP. He highlighted that the MP government organises Jan Sunwai programs and officers concerned with welfare of PwDs are also posted so that the grievances of PwDs are addressed.

6.4 Hon'ble Minister referred to the pension given to PwDs of Rs. 600/- only and requested the CAB to take necessary action so that a request can be shared with the concerned Ministry/Department for increasing the amount of pension.

[Action: DEPwD]

6.5 Lastly, appreciating the Divya Kala Mela and entrepreneurs with disabilities, Hon'ble Minister referred to the DKM held in Jabalpur and mentioned that the MP government has issued orders that all government offices in MP to have at least one shop/ stall managed by PwDs in the office premises.

Dr. M Mathivethan, Hon'ble Minister of Adi Dravida Welfare, Tamil Nadu

6.6 Hon'ble Minister expressed the commitment of Tamil Nadu Government to welfare of Persons with Disabilities. In 1993, Govt of Tamil Nadu established a separate Directorate for Disability under Social Welfare Department and in 2010 the TN government created a dedicated Secretariat for Persons with Disability.

Hon'ble Minister highlighted the flagship initiative called Tamil Nadu Rights project with the assistance from World Bank. The project is aimed at inclusivity, accessibility and opportunities for persons with disabilities.

6.7 The Government has developed a Social Registry Enrolment to capture information of PwDs for which a state wide field survey is being done to identify deceased, migrated, ineligible persons and create a database of PwDs who are eligible for various welfare schemes. In this regard, the Hon'ble Minister indicated that UDID database reveals that 8.46 Lakh cards have been issued to PwDs of TN. He further requested DEPwD to provide two-way access of API of UDID database in order to keep track of deceased and migrated PwDs.

6.8 Further, the Hon'ble Minister also brought to notice that the Directorate of Welfare of Persons with Disabilities in Tamil Nadu is headed by an IAS officer and has rehabilitation professionals posted in each district of the state since 1995. Referring to the rules for states under RPwD Act, 2016 Hon'ble Minister informed the Board that, the Tamil Nadu state has appointed independent State Commissioner for PwDs with responsibilities as per RPwD Act, 2016. In this regard, the Hon'ble Minister brought attention to the estimated expenses of the SCPD that is Rs. 2.21 Crore including non-recurring expense of 24.8 lakh per year and requested support from the Central Government for the operation of the SCPD office of Tamil Nadu.

6.9 Highlighting the initiatives of TN government like monthly maintenance grants, assistive devices, scholarships and travel concession, the Hon'ble Minister sought attention to the newly inaugurated Centre of Excellence for Autism Spectrum Disorder that focuses on holistic rehabilitation for persons with Autism with special attention on early childhood intervention for children aged 0-6 years. In this regard, Hon'ble Minister requested the board members to visit the centre and also requested financial assistance of Rs. 25 Crore from the Union Government, under the SIPDA scheme, for enhancing the capabilities and services the Centre.

6.10 Hon'ble Minister requested that the data of PwDs that receive the scholarships from DEPwD may be shared with the state annually.

[Action: DEPwD]

6.11 The Hon'ble Minister also requested to the release of 2nd instalment under AIC for the 19 buildings that have been made accessible.

[Action: DEPwD]

6.12 Lastly, the Hon'ble Minister brought forth the agenda that were put up in the last CAB meeting by the Tamil Nadu government where he requested that the contributions of Rs. 300 by the Central government under Indira Gandhi Disability Pension Scheme of may be disbursed to all the 5.29 Lakh PwDs in the state of TN and also that the amount of Rs. 1500/- that is currently being borne by the State Exchequer may also be taken up by the Central Government.

Adv. Shri Umesh Andhare, Nagpur- From Saksham- National Head-

6.13 Requested to develop interventions in inclusive/special education for persons with intellectual disabilities including persons with Autism, Down Syndrome among others. Even Age wise relaxations should be provided for Persons with IDs so that admission may be given based on the IQ and not on biological age. Grants from the Government may be provided to NGOs that provide residential/ stay home facilities for Persons with IDs.

6.14 Further the member pointed out that the training facilities for Paralympics may also be enhanced so that PwDs can have opportunities for participating in Paralympics.

6.15 Lastly the member highlighted that the appointment of independent Chief Commissioner of Persons with Disabilities post has been vacant since last 6 years and this the same may be filled as soon as possible

Smt. Padma, Commissioner Secretary, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Ladhak

6.16 The Hon'ble member requested that the pension disbursement, which is currently done by the Ministry of Rural Development needs to be provided by MSJE for old age and widows and PwDs.

Shri H. Srinivas, Airports Authority of India, Ministry of Civil Aviation-

6.17 The member highlighted that AAI has published the Accessibility standards and guidelines and also made the infrastructure at all Airports accessible except 8 airports that shall also be made accessible in the near future.

Shri Kumarpal Mehta, Delhi

6.18 The member requested attention of the board on the lack of awareness about Disability certificate and requested the Department to create more awareness about the generation of Disability certificate among PwDs. Secondly, the member requested to provide information on the insurance for PwDs ad to make the process faster so that PwDs can avail insurance facilities. Further the member requested to increase the frequency of CAB meetings and if the CAB meetings can be held on quarterly basis. Lastly the member requested that the CAB Board Members should be informed about the initiatives, programmes, events of the Department so that awareness of the initiatives can be increased by the board members.

[Action: DEPwD]

Shri Uday Prakash, Saksham National Advisory Board

6.19 The member requested that Training and sensitization of Judges and Public prosecutors in regards to the matters related to persons with disabilities. Further the member requested to review of the identification of reserved posts in central and state governments for PwDs which are about to complete 3 years from the date of the respective orders of identification of Posts for PwDs.

[Action: DEPwD]

Dr Avinash, Pune Cochlear Pune

6.20 The member requested attention that under ADIP scheme Cochlear implant operations have been paused and thus the same needs to review.

[Action: DEPWD]

6.21 Secondly the member highlighted that there is a lack special educators for persons with hearing impaired. In this regard, the member suggested to train mothers of persons with hearing impaired can be trained to become special educators and thus requested to explore anyscheme for development of special educators.

[Action: RCI]

Ms. Ruma Banerjee, Seva and Action, Bangalore

6.22 The member requested attention on the Early Intervention scheme and the extension of this with Health department for reaching to rural and tribal villages. Moreover, the member sought attention on the Aspirational districts program and the implementation of schemes of DEPWD at these Aspirational Districts.

6.23 Further the member highlighted the importance of inclusive education as per NEP, 2020 and advised that special educators can also be paid at the level of regular teacher in order to promote Inclusive education.

6.24 Lastly the members highlighted the need to develop skills training programmes that are customised for persons with intellectual disabilities and encourage livelihood/placement

Shri Guruprasad Pawaskar, Goa State Commissioner for PwDs

6.25 The member requested that recommendations provided by state commissioners are not implemented as they are treated as suggestions not directions by state departments. In this regard, clarity on the powers of the State Commissioner in line with the RPwDAct, 2016.

Member from Dadar and Nagar Haveli

6.26 The member requested that the pension for PwDs under Ministry of Rural Development needs clarity on the eligibility criteria as well as universal coverage of PwDs.

[Action: M/o Rural Development]

6.27 In this regard, the member informed requested on that the pension may be taken under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment thus the needed coordination between state and central ministries may be initiated. Further the member indicated that the Medical boards are delaying process of issuing disability certificates.

Xi .Prof Dyal Singh Pawar, Lal Bahardur Shashtri Vishwavidyalay

6.28 The member requested to encourage academic institutions like IITs to develop new assistive devices and also devices from foreign countries can be made taxfree for PwDs. Further the member requested that state universities for persons with disabilities may be provided special status from UGC for research in the field of PwDs. In this regard even All universities can be motivated to work for disability.

[Action: UGC]

Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Kerala

6.29 The member highlighted that the Old age policy should be integrated with the schemes of PwDs. In this regard, the member highlighted that NITI Aayog has created a committee for strengthening of old age and schemes related to PwDs can thus be integrated. Moreover, the member requested attention on the regulatory framework

needed for the sales of assistive devices like hearing aids, walking sticks, electronic wheelchairs, etc. as these assistive devices are used by the poor and elderly population. Further the member also requested to review the quality of the products manufactured by ALIMCO and explore ways it can be improved. Lastly the member requested support from central government for onboarding private medical practitioners of issuing disability certificates.

Sh. Jay Singh Chuahan Nagpur Maharashtra, Leads Divyang Wing of Maharashtra

6.30 The member requested focus on self-employment and reviewing NDFDC's loan scheme to reduce the delay in processing of loans for employment. The member also requested to develop synergies between ALIMCO for developing wheelchairs that support self-employment and private sector companies for CSR funds that can be utilized for encouraging self-employment.

Sh. Govindraj from Tamil Nadu Saksham

6.31 The member requested focus on Leprosy cured deformed persons and reviewing the 8 acts/laws that are found discriminatory for Leprosy Cured/ Deformed person.

[Action: M/o Law and Justice]

6.32 Further the member requested that Braille papers used by persons with visual impairment for writing and printing may be exempted from GST.

[Action: D/o Revenue]

Member from Meghalaya

6.33 The member from Meghalaya requested financial support from DEPwD for the Make ability app.]

7.1 Secretary DEPwD responded to the issues raised by Hon'ble Ministers and members of the CAB. He appreciated the work of MP government. He also informed

that a visit may be planned to Tamil Nadu to understand the model and explore scope of collaboration.

7.2 The data of ADIP/AIC/scholarship shall be provided with full access to state governments. Secretary DEPwD agreed on the increase of persons with intellectual disability that is even reflected in the survey of AIIMS and thus the need to develop interventions for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities.

7.3 With regard to special Olympics Secretary DEPwD informed that Sports ministry is funding for these events and facilities are available at CDS Gwalior. He further noted that the process of regular appointment of CCPD is under full swing and expected to be completed soon.

7.4 Secretary DEPwD requested the member from AAI, to sensitize staff/security at Airports so that they behave cordially with PwDs visiting airport.

7.5 Secretary DEPwD also agreed on the need of awareness of disability certificate generation process as well as awareness of the initiatives of DEPwD among CAB board members through creation of a master mail list.

7.6 Secretary DEPwD appreciated the suggestion to train/ sensitize Public prosecutor and informed that the Department shall be willing to implement these training in collaboration with M/o Law.

[Action: DEPwD/ M/o Law and Justice]

7.7 He took cognizance of the dearth of Audio Verbal Therapist (AVT) and informed that DEPwD is in discussion with AISH, Mysore for increasing the number of AVT . Secretary also informed the members that for Persons with hearing impairment, the DISLI and DTISL courses have been started at various National Institutes and CRCs of DEPwD aiming at around 5000 sign language interpreters/deaf teachers in the country within two years.

7.8 Taking note of the issues raised for persons with intellectual disability, Secretary, DEPwD informed that the Department has developed short term care givers course for mothers/ parents of PwIDs. He requested the state governments to match the salary levels of all special educators with that of regular teachers. He informed the board members that Ministry of Education has issued a circular that all special schools, irrespective of the Ministries controlling them, can take benefit of all the schemes that are applicable for regular schools under Ministry of Education.

He also noted that deliberations are in place for deciding the definite roles of CCPD/ SCPDs under the ambit of RPwD Act 2016.

7.9 Secretary DEPwD also informed that DEPwD is working with IITs on various aspects and DEPwD is open to fund any university that needs funds for research on disability. In this regard, the Department with RCI had meeting with 90 universities/ schools for providing support in research cells for disability in Universities.

7.10 He has apprised the Board members that after modernization of ALIMCO, significant improvement has been made in the quality of the products. Regarding laws/acts related to Leprosy Cured persons, Secretary DEPwD informed that letters have been sent to respective Ministries/State Governments for taking necessary action. Lastly Secretary DEPwD appreciated the suggestions from the members and thanked all the members for their active participation.

8.1 Dr. Virendra Kumar, the Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice and Empowerment (HMSJE), extended a warm welcome to the Hon'ble Ministers representing various States/UTs, CAB members, delegates from States/NGOs, representative from Central Ministries/ Departments and expressed appreciation for the collective efforts dedicated to the empowerment of Persons with Disabilities by the Centre, various States/UTs and NGOs/organizations/stakeholders.

8.2 He highlighted the role of Central Advisory Board meetings in fostering inspiration among States and Union Territories that is serving as a platform for sharing exemplary practices, providing an invaluable opportunity for learning and implementing similar initiatives in their respective jurisdictions. Emphasizing the forward-looking approach of the Hon'ble Prime Minister's vision - "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, aur Sabka Prayas," the HMSJE further stated that the Ministry seeks guidance of all the Board members who are working in various capacities in the Society for the overall empowerment of Divyangjans.

8.3 He noted the need for the persons with disabilities to be self-reliant by making their disability a strength not a weakness in line with the Vision for 2047 i.e. Atmanirbhar Bharat. He highlighted the imperative need for sincere efforts in all areas of Accessible India Campaign to empower Persons with Disabilities, which require contribution of states/ UTs and NGOs/ Civil Society Organizations that shall empower PwDs and contribute to the country's promising future.

8.4 He also urged that states need to further boost their efforts towards implementing the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 by referring to the appointment of independent State Commissioners of PwDs which has also been taken up by the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Hon'ble Minister thus urged states to take special cognisance of the mandates under RPwD Act 2016 and implement the same in letter and spirit.

8.5 Further, underscoring the importance of Indian Sign Language HMSJE informed about the various sectors in which ISL has been developed like legal, educational, social, etc. He thus highlighted that ISL is enhancing communication accessibility in all sectors for persons with hearing impairment.

8.6 Hon'ble Minister appreciated the efforts of states in generating more than 1 crore UDID cards and also urged state governments to speed-up the process of creating UDID cards so that PwDs can take benefits of the schemes meant for them. He

highlighted the Rashtriya Vayshria Yojana under which assistive aids and appliances are provided to elderly by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment through ALIMCO. In this regard, he informed that ALIMCO has undergone modernisation at a cost of more than 300 crore and this has also improved the quality and capability of the assistive aids and appliances manufactured by ALIMCO that these are now exported to foreign countries. The motorized tricycle received through ALIMCO is creating self-employment opportunities for PwDs across the country and empowering not only themselves but also their families.

8.7 Further the Hon'ble Minister brought forth the transformative work being done by NIEPVD, Dehradun by creating science labs for persons with visual impairments. He even pointed out the work of Department in economic empowerment of PwDs through the loan scheme of NDFDC.

8.8 Lastly, Hon'ble Minister pointed out the role of Central Advisory Board meeting and expressed his desire to extend the time of the CAB in the next meetings as well as give more time to the members to discuss on the agenda points. He concluded and thanked all the members of the board for their inputs and contribution to the 7th CAB.

9. The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair from the Member-Secretary, CAB and JS(Policy), DEPwD.



- ❖ A Writ Petition (Civil) No. 29329 of 2021 was filed by Ms. Seema Girija Lal against Union of India and others in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India seeking directions for implementation of provisions (appointment of State Commissioner, notification of Rules etc.) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 by the States and Union Territories.
- ❖ Further, the matter was heard by the Hon'ble Court on 22.04.2024 and Hon'ble Court passed the following order - The implementation of the Act needs to be set right. The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities in the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment shall duly take up the issue with all their counterparts in the States/Union Territories and report the updated status of compliance before this Court on or before the next date of listing.

Status of Implementation of AIC

The case of **Rajive Raturi v. Union of India & Others (2017)**

- The case is based on a report submitted by the Centre for Disability Studies, NALSAR University of Law. As per CDS NALSAR Report- PwDs face issues regarding - Accessibility barriers, Intersectionality and compounded discrimination, Inconsistency in legal framework
- The Union Government has been directed to delineate mandatory rules, as required by Section 40. This exercise may involve segregating the non-negotiable rules from the expansive guidelines already prescribed in Rule 15. a baseline of non-negotiable rules must be prescribed in Rule 15.
- the Union of India, States and Union Territories are directed to ensure that the consequences prescribed in Sections 44, 45, 46 and 89 of the RPwD Act including the holding back of completion certificates and imposition of fines are implemented in cases of non- compliance with Rule 15,

Other issues to discuss in respect of AIC

- 75 Pilgrim places identified by DEPwD and requested states for their Accessibility Audit. 43 Pilgrimage places are pending for accessibility audit and submission of proposal thereon

- A significant number of grievances are still pending regarding Built up environment & web/digital accessibility on Sugamya Bharat App which need redressal.

- All States/UTs were given funds in the previous years in r/o which the utilization certificates and physical progress reports are still pending.



Status of Implementation of AIC

CAB may urge to all State/UT Governments/Ministries/Departments as per their concerned matter:-

❖ To submit pending UCs or initiate the process of refunding the unutilised amount. Also to utilise the unutilised amount in CNA account or refund the same.

❖ To consider the grievances received for the inaccessible built environment and take necessary action in this matter considering the mandatory provision of RPwD Act, 2016 in terms of providing accessible infrastructure.

❖ To take immediate action for compliance of Section 45(1) of the RPwD Act, 2016 which mandates that all the existing public buildings be made accessible within a period of 5 years from the date of notification of accessibility standards i.e. by 14.06.2022.

❖ The Ministries/Departments who are yet to issue the sector specific accessibility guidelines to expedite the process


Agenda 5 : Status of Status of implementation of the RPwD (Amendment) Rules, 2017 notified vide G.S.R. 649(E) dated 16.10.2024 w.r.t. disability certificate and UDID Card

- Rule 17 & 18 of the RPwD Rules, 2017 provides for application and issuance for certificate of disability.
- UDID project being implemented since 2016-17 with a view to creating a National Database for PwDs and also to issue Unique Disability ID cards to each PwD. So far more than 1.15 crore UDID cards generated. State-wise dependency position in r/o digitization of the manual certificate of Disability
- The Govt amended the Rule 17 & 18 of the RPwD Rules 2017 vide G.S.R. 649 (E) dated 16.10.2024.
- The Central Government earlier issued guidelines for assessing the extent of specified disabilities on 14.03.2024.

► The Board may urge :-
❖ States/UTs to ensure availability of sufficient number of medical professionals at all levels so as to streamline the process of disability certification as per new assessment guidelines dated 14.03.2024 ;
❖ The States/UTs to give wide publicity to the RPwD (Amendment) Rules, 2024 dated 16.10.2024 ; and
❖ To expedite the digitization of manual certificate of disability. Other States/UTs also to complete the digitization exercise.


Infrastructure Physical and Digital





Intellectual Disability

- ⑭ NIPEID Indian test of intelligence for persons with Intellectual disability with computer-based assessment
- ⑮ Tata Power Community Development Trust along with NIEPID Secunderabad has developed E-Sanidhya Portal an E-Platform for persons with disabilities

New Initiatives under AIC

- ❖ 2-Day Web Accessibility Workshop held for all IT Developers of DEPwD and its National Institutes.
- ❖ 13 Persons with Disabilities trained with support of BarrierBreak and American India Foundation on Web Accessibility to appear for Certification of International Association of Accessibility Professionals
- ❖ The Council of Architecture (COA) and DEPwD have taken significant steps towards promoting accessibility in built environment for empowering PwDs by signing a MOU. The Council successfully conducted online training programs to certify Master Trainers for the Universal Accessibility Auditors programme
- ❖ The DEPwD and EnableMe Access have signed a MoU on 09.07.2024. A 05-days training and sensitization sessions on Universal Design and Accessibility in the Built Environment was organized in the month of August 2024. Approx. 40 participants attended the session.
- ❖ An Expression of Interest (EOI) for empanelment of access auditors for Web/Digital Accessibility was floated on 15.10.2024. As on date, total 10 EOI have been received
- ❖ Project proposal for imparting training on Web Accessibility Guidelines to technical resources within Government Ministries/Departments and Agencies supporting Website/Web-Application development received from NIC has been approved by the Department

Agenda 8 : Some of the recommendations made by National Human Rights Commission in its annual report for the year 2022-23

► The Board may recommend :-

- National Human Rights Commission in its meeting dated 13.04.2022 of core Group on Rights of Persons with disabilities made many recommendations related to accessibility, reasonable accommodation, district disability committee and special courts.
- These recommendations are also part of NHRC's Annual Report for the year 2022-23 to be laid on the Table of both Houses of Parliament.

- ❖ Concerned Ministries/Departments may study these recommendations and take appropriate action.
- ❖ The States/UTs may explore the feasibility of implementing these recommendations of NHRC. The alignment of State's Development Control Rules and General Building Requirements with the Harmonised Guidelines for public buildings may be done immediately.
- ❖ Concerned Ministries/Departments and States/UTs may file ATR on the recommendations of NHRC within a period of one month from the date of this meeting.

Agenda 9 : Measures taken to estimate the total no. of PwDs as well as no. of PwDs employed in govt and private establishments in respective States/UTs

► In India, the major source of statistics is Census 2011 which puts the total number of PwDs at 2.68 crore, however it took into account only 7 categories of disabilities as specified in now repealed PwD Act, 1995.

► However, in all probability the number of PwDs in the country must have increased significantly in view of increasing number of disabilities and population growth.


► The correct estimation of disability population as well as employment data in r/o PwDs in the country is crucial for policy formulation.

Since the Department relies on the census data and it is taking time for the said data to be ready, DEPwD requested all States/UTs on 29.08.2024 to share results of any such survey/s that are being conducted by States/UTs

► State/UTs were also requested on 18.11.2024 to share the number of PwDs working in State Government establishments as well as private sector companies. This data is awaited from the States/UTs.
