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# SUMMARY

NIEPID (formerly known as NIMH), established in 1984, undertakes multifarious activities to enhance the quality of life of persons with Intellectual Disability. The functional objectives are:

- To create manpower and develop Human Resources for delivery of services to Persons with Intellectual Disability.
- To identify, conduct and coordinate research in the area of Intellectual Disability in the country.
- To develop appropriate models of care and habilitation for persons with Intellectual Disability suitable to Indian culture.
- To provide consultancy services to voluntary organizations in the area of Intellectual Disability.
- To serve as a documentation and information centre in the area of Intellectual Disability.
- To develop community-based rehabilitation services in the rural and low-income needy population.
- To undertake extension and outreach programmes in the field of Intellectual Disability.

## Intellectual Disability

Intellectual Disability ranks among the world's most complex and challenging problems. According to the Census of India, 2011, the number of Persons with Disabilities in the country is 2.68 crores, and the number of persons with Intellectual Disability is 15,05,624. It means the prevalence of Intellectual Disability is estimated to be 124 per a lakh population in India.

## About the Institute

NIEPID has its headquarters at Secunderabad, Telangana. It has seven departments, namely Rehabilitation Psychology, Special Education, Medical Sciences, Therapeutics, Adult Independent Living, Community Rehabilitation & Project Management and Library & Information Sciences.

It has three Regional Centres, each located at Noida/New Delhi, Kolkata and Navi Mumbai. NIEPID has a Model Special Education Centre in New Delhi / Noida. It also has three Composite Regional Centres for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of persons with disability at Nellore in Andhra Pradesh state, Davanagere in Karnataka State and Rajnandgaon in Chhattisgarh state.

## Human Resource Development

During the year, 578 professionals/personnel were enrolled / trained through 10 long term academic programmes conducted at NIEPID HQs, its Regional Centres and CRCs.



The Institute conducted 258 online Short Term Training Programmes/Certificate courses/Webinars benefiting 25,089 professionals from special education, psychology, speech therapy, occupational therapy, vocational rehabilitation etc., from various parts of the country.

### Research and Development

- During 2023-24, three projects were ongoing, three projects were completed and four new projects have been approved.
- During the year, 19 research articles were published in various national and international journals by NIEPID staff/ faculty.
- During the year, 214 scientific conferences/seminars/workshops were attended by NIEPID staff as participants and resource persons.

### General Services

- During 2023-24, 16,286 new clients were registered at OPD and were provided comprehensive assessment, management and intervention programmes at NIEPID HQs, its Regional Centres and CRCs including NIEPID-MSEC. In addition, 26,268 new clients were assessed during outreach camps.
- A total of 1,60,733 clients were given Follow up Services during the year at NIEPID HQs, its Regional Centres and CRCs including NIEPID-MSEC. Also, 17,461 clients were provided follow up services during outreach camps.
- A total of 4,57,606 support services were provided to new and follow up clients during the year at NIEPID HQs, its Regional Centres and CRCs, including NIEPID-MSEC.
- A total of 2,721 new cases, 6,073 follow up cases and 36,820 supportive services were provided at Cross Disability Early Intervention Centre.
- NIEPID has the facility of 'Family Cottage Services' for families coming from far-off places. During their stay, they receive professional training services based on the need assessment. During the year, 480 clients, along with their families, utilized the Family Cottage Services.
- A total of 1,682 adults with Intellectual Disabilities received Vocational Assessment, Guidance and Counselling services during the year. A total of 19,699 adults with ID have been given training in various workstations during the reporting year at DAIL.
- A total of 14,275 parents benefited through 214 parent training programmes during the reporting year.
- Respite Care Centre, a short-term care facility for children with intellectual disabilities to relieve their family from the stress of routine care at home, provided services to PWIDs and their families during the year. A total of 3,748 (new and follow up) beneficiaries availed the services of respite care.
- Feedback from the clients about various services provided by the professionals showed that 81.3% of clients/ parents were satisfied with the services provided by NIEPID.



### **Department of Rehabilitation Psychology (DRP)**

- DRP conducted M.Phil. in Rehabilitation Psychology course approved by RCI and affiliated to Osmania University, Hyderabad.
- The department conducted 10 online short term training programs/webinars through which 800 professionals were imparted training in psychological aspects.
- A total of 4,121 new clients and 4,854 follow up clients were provided services by Psychology professionals and provided 21,248 support services to new and follow up clients during the year.

### **Department of Special Education (DSE)**

- The department conducted four long term programs namely D.Ed.SE (IDD), DECSE (ID), B.Ed.SE(ID) and M.Ed.SE(ID).
- DSE conducted 16 short term training programs benefiting 1,419 professionals.
- A total of 4,028 new clients and 12,435 follow up clients were provided services by Special Education professionals and provided 52,138 support services to new and follow up clients during the year.
- The Special Education Centre (SEC) had an enrolment of 127 children with ID in the age range of 3 years to 18 years ranging from mild to profound levels. SEC provided support services to 35,716 clients.
- SEC conducted 7 STPs were conducted benefiting 300 professionals and 16 parent training programmes benefiting 533 parents/ siblings.
- A total of 33 students were enrolled for NIOS education, out of these 23 students appeared & passed the final examination (level A, B, C).

### **Department of Medical Sciences (DMS)**

- A total of 7,430 new clients and 28,164 follow up clients were seen by the Department of Medical Sciences and provided 90,279 support services to new and follow up clients during the year.
- The department runs a long term course in early intervention namely Post Graduate Diploma in Early Intervention (PGDEI).
- During the year, 3 STPs were conducted benefiting 67 professionals
- During the year, 22 Parent Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 7,590 parents of children with Intellectual Disability.

### **Department of Therapeutics (DOT)**

- A total of 1,687 new clients and 8,532 follow up clients were seen by the Department of Therapeutics and 15,655 support services were provided to these new and follow up clients during the year.
- Inputs in theory & practical classes were provided to students of long term courses throughout the year by Faculty & Technical staff of the department.





- During the year, 8 STPs were conducted benefiting 487 professionals, and 8 Webinars were conducted benefiting 800 professionals.

#### **Department of Adult Independent Living (DAIL)**

- During the year, 1 STP was conducted benefiting 23 professionals, and 4 Webinars were conducted benefiting 3,684 professionals in vocational rehabilitation of PwIDs.
- One year Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) Course is also conducted by the Department.
- A total of 277 new clients and 19,681 follow up clients were seen by DAIL and provided 21,818 support services were provided to these new and follow up clients during the year.

#### **Department of Library & Information Sciences**

- NIEPID has published 109 publications (titles) as of date. A total of 2,402 copies of these publications were sold during the year. In addition to this, 168 software programs/Video films on disabilities were sold during the year.
- More than 16,013 professionals/students/parents have utilized the library facilities during the year.

#### **Regional Centre, Noida & New Delhi**

- The centre conducted three long term courses of two years duration each, namely M.Ed. in Special education (ID), B.Ed. in Special Education (ID) and D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD) during the year. In addition, the Centre conducted 12 STPs benefiting 425 professionals and 1 Webinar was conducted benefiting 248 professionals.
- During the year, 1,643 new clients and 6,034 follow up clients were seen at RC Noida & New Delhi and 34,955 support services were provided to new and follow up clients during the year.
- During the year, 31 Parent Training Programmes were conducted benefiting 837 parents.

#### **Regional Centre, Kolkata**

- NIEPID Regional Centre, Kolkata, conducted five long term programs, namely M.Ed. in Special Education (ID), B.Ed. in Special Education (ID), D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD), Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (ID) and B.Ed. in Special Education (ID) - Open Distance Learning.
- A total of 22 STPs were conducted, benefiting 1,752 professionals, and 12 Webinars were conducted benefiting 806 professionals.
- A total of 1,998 new clients and 35,228 follow up clients were seen at RC Kolkata and 46,615 support services were provided to these new and follow up clients during the year.
- RC Kolkata conducted 26 Parent Training Programmes benefiting 836 parents/siblings, during the year.



### **Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai**

- This Centre conducted five long term courses, namely M.Ed. in Special Education (ID), B.Ed. in Special Education (ID), D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD), Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (ID) and Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (ID).
- A total of 21 STPs were conducted benefiting 1,990 professionals, and 21 Webinars were conducted benefiting 2,190 professionals.
- A total of 1,453 new clients and 24,279 follow up clients were seen at RC Navi Mumbai and 30,407 support services were provided to new and follow up clients during the year.
- During the year, 32 Parent Training Programmes benefiting 764 parents/siblings.

### **Model Special Education Centre, Noida & New Delhi**

- During the year, Model Special Education Centre had 85 students were enrolled.
- MSEC conducted 16 Parent Training Programmes benefiting 452 parents/siblings.

### **Extension & Outreach Services**

- During the year 2023-24, a total of 30,464 people benefited through 360 Community Based programmes (Other than north east, orientation to visiting teams, awareness rallies etc.,).
- Programmes such as awareness rallies, orientation programmes for visiting teams, assessment camps, NPM/ RPMs and Exhibitions on awareness about disability were conducted.
- During the year, 68 programs were conducted, benefiting 20,934 persons under North East Scheme.

### **Assistance to Disabled Persons for Purchase/Fitting of Aids and Appliances (ADIP) Scheme**

- During 2023-24, 3,585 TLM kits were distributed under ADIP Scheme through centrebased programmes and 6,557 kits through 65 camps.

### **National Programmes and other activities:**

- The Institute continued to render services through the Toll-free number 18005726422 created in the year 2020 for the benefit of parents of PwIDs to avail telecall services in any field related to Intellectual Disability. This has been very useful for the parents who seek services, especially during the pandemic situation where the clients could not reach the professionals directly because of lockdown. All the follow-up services were availed through tele services.
- Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment and Shri A. Narayanaswamy, Hon'ble Minister of State of Social Justice & Empowerment participated in International Yoga Day Celebrations, at Kanha Wellness Centre, Kanha



Village, Rangareddy District, Telangana on 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 organised by DEPwD & coordinated by NIEPID, Secunderabad. Department created three records viz. International Wonder Book of Records , Asia Book of Records and India Book of Records for the maximum number of Divyangjan performing Mass Yoga.

- The Institute developed NIEPID Indian Test of Intelligence, the first of its kind in the entire country for Psychological Assessment of IQ in individuals. The Test has been released and dedicated to the Nation by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2023 at New Delhi.
- Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment Govt. of India laid Foundation Stone for the Hydrotherapy Unit virtually on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2024. In an endeavor to promote good quality therapeutic intervention to persons with Disabilities, NIEPID in joint collaboration with The Hans Foundation is setting up a Hydrotherapy Unit at NIEPID premises at Manovikas Nagar, Secunderabad.
- On 21<sup>st</sup> February 2024, CRC, Davanagere's & CRC, Rajnandgaon's New Building was virtually inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment Govt of India.
- Divya Kala Shakthi programme was organized by NIEPID, Secunderabad in collaboration with Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) on 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2024. Hon'ble Governor of Telangana and Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Puducherry, Dr. Tamilisai Sounderarajan was the Chief Guest for the programme who keenly watched the programme and appreciated and motivated all the participants. In her address, the Governor appreciated the exemplary efforts made by NIEPID and its staff for creating a platform for the persons with disabilities.
- NIEPID, Secunderabad organized 29<sup>th</sup> National Parents Meet in collaboration with PARIVAAR NCPO from 02<sup>nd</sup> to 03<sup>rd</sup> March, 2024. Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, GoI attended as Chief Guest to this program through online mode and addressed the Parents, NGO's and Children with Special needs who attended this program from different states throughout the country. A total of 360 parents and children with special needs across the country attended this 29<sup>th</sup> National Parents Meet.
- During the year 2023-24, 3 Regional Parents Meets were held benefiting 479 parents.
- The 29<sup>th</sup> Special Employees National Meet was held on 08<sup>th</sup> & 09<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at NIEPID, Secunderabad. A total of 149 Special employees participated in the programme.
- National Conference on "Transformative Solutions and Innovations in Disability Rehabilitation (NCTSISR) - 2023" was held on 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2023 at NIEPID, Secunderabad. A total of 204 professionals/ students/ parents / PwDs and other stake holders participated in this conference.
- National Conference on Techno-Pedagogic Approach in Rehabilitation of Children with Special Needs, "Rehabilitation 2.0" was held on 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2023 at NIEPID, Secunderabad. The conference was inaugurated by Chief Guest, Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, Govt. of India. A total of 312 rehabilitation professionals and other stakeholders from 10 different states participated in this conference.



- The National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID) organised a Two Day International Workshop on Indian Scale for Assessment of Autism (ISAA) AT DAIC, New Delhi on 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2023. The conference was inaugurated by Chief Guest, Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPWD, MSJ&E, Govt. of India and it was graced by Shri Rajeev Sharma, IFoS, Joint Secretary DEPWD, MSJ&E, GoI, Shri Vineet Singhal, Director, National Institutes, DEPwD, GoI. A total of 82 participants from India and 18 participants from 11 countries participated.
- Three days of International CRE workshop on NIEPID Indian test of intelligence at NIEPID RC, NOIDA from 29<sup>th</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024. A total of 81 participants who were RCI registered psychologists and other Rehabilitation professionals from different organizations participated.
- As part of Autism Awareness Week (from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> April 2023), NIEPID HQs, Regional Centres and Composite Regional Centres observed World Autism Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2023, and also organized weeklong programmes.
- The 132<sup>nd</sup> birthday of Bharat Ratna Dr. B R Ambedkar was observed on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023 at Auditorium, NIEPID, Secunderabad. Major B V Ram Kumar, Director, NIEPID and all HODs of various departments along with all staff, faculty and students were present in the programme.
- On the occasion of Global Accessibility Awareness Day (GAAD), DEPwD, Govt of India, and NIEPID Secunderabad organised National Level Webinar on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2023. - Provided support for North East Programmes and ADIP Camps of NIEPID.



### **Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRC), Rajnandgaon**

- A total of 1,547 new clients and 14,973 follow-up clients were seen at CRC, Rajnandgaon and 46,521 support services were provided to the new and follow-up clients during the year.
- During the year, 15 Short-Term Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 780 professionals.
- During the year, 49 Webinars were conducted, benefiting 2,999 professionals.
- During the year, 7 Parent Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 173 parents.
- The centre provided support for North East Programmes and ADIP Camps of NIEPID.





# Chapter 1

## About the Institute

### 1.1 Introduction

The National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID), (Divyangjan), formerly known as National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped (NIMH), is a registered society established in the year 1984, as an autonomous body under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. The institute is an apex body having tripartite functions of training, research and services in the field of Intellectual Disability in the country.

For the last 40 years, the Institute has been making significant advances in building capacities to empower persons with Intellectual Disability. Based on the latest developments and recent trends in the field, the Institute strives to organize new programmes and make innovations through research and development. National and International collaborations entered into by the Institute in its various activities reflect the global characteristics of the organization. The activities of NIEPID are planned following the mandates of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), the Legislative Acts, and the National Policy promulgated for the Persons with Disabilities.

NIEPID strives to be an Institute of excellence focusing on high standards in every aspect of its functioning to bring equality and dignity in the lives of persons with Intellectual Disability (PwID), which is endorsed by ISO 9001:2015 certification.

NIEPID has made noticeable progress in Human Resource Development, Research and Development and Direct Therapeutic Clinical Services to improve the quality of life of persons with Intellectual Disability.

### 1.2 Intellectual Disability

Intellectual Disability ranks among the world's most complex and challenging problems. It is a multi-dimensional phenomenon involving bio-psycho-social factors.

It is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of the mind, primarily characterized by impairment of skills manifested during the developmental period. These skills contribute to the overall level of intelligence, i.e., cognitive, language, motor and social abilities.

According to the RPWD Act, 2016, "Intellectual disability is a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem-solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills."



### 1.3 Prevalence of Intellectual Disabilities

According to the Census of India, 2011, the number of Persons with Disabilities in the country is 2.68 crores. It is also estimated that the number of persons with Intellectual Disability is 1,505,624. It means in every one lakh persons in our total population, 124 persons have Intellectual Disability. The number of persons with disabilities and Intellectual Disability as estimated by Census India 2011 is given in **Table 1a** and **Table 1b**.

## 1.4 Objectives

NIEPID, at its inception itself, projected multifarious activities to enhance the quality of life of persons with Intellectual Disability. Accordingly, the aims and objectives of the institute have been spelt out as follows:

- To conduct, sponsor, coordinate or subsidize research into all aspects of the education and rehabilitation of Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
- To undertake, sponsor, coordinate or subsidize research into bio-medical engineering leading to the practical evaluation of aids/suitable surgical or medical procedure or the development of new aids.
- To undertake or sponsor the training of trainees and teachers, employment of officers, psychologists, vocational counsellors, and other personnel as may be deemed necessary by the Institute for promoting the education, training, or rehabilitation of Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
- To distribute or promote or subsidize the manufacture of proto-types and distribution of any or all aids designed to promote any aspects of the education, rehabilitation or therapy of Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.

From the above aims and objectives, the following functional objectives evolved:

### 1.4.1 NIEPID Objectives

- To create manpower and develop Human Resources for delivery of services to Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
- To identify, conduct and coordinate research in the area of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities in the country.
- To develop appropriate models of care and habilitation for Persons with Intellectual and



Developmental Disabilities suitable to Indian culture.

- To provide consultancy services to voluntary organizations in the area of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
- To serve as a documentation and information centre in the area of Intellectual Disability.
- To develop community-based rehabilitation services for the rural and low income disadvantaged population.
- To undertake extension and outreach programmes in the field of Intellectual Disability.

### 1.4.2 Organizational Setup

NIEPID has its headquarters at Secunderabad, Telangana. It has seven departments, namely Rehabilitation Psychology, Special Education, Medical Sciences, Therapeutics, Adult Independent Living, Community Rehabilitation & Project Management and Library & Information Sciences.

There are three Regional Centres, each located at New Delhi /Noida, Kolkata and Navi Mumbai. NIEPID has a Model Special Education Centre in Noida. Composite Regional Centre at Nellore was set up in January 2016, and it was shifted to its permanent building in February 2019. NIEPID set up CRC at Davanagere in Karnataka State in March 2017 and shifted to permanent building at Vaddanahalli, Davanagere was virtually inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India on 21st February, 2024. The administrative control of CRC at Rajnandgaon in Chhattisgarh State was transferred to NIEPID in May 2020. The new building of CRC Rajnandgaon constructed at Thakurtola, Rajnandgaon was virtually inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2024. The organizational chart depicting the overall functioning of NIEPID is shown in **Appendix C (Page -146)**.

### 1.4.3 Functioning of Regional Centres

#### 1.4.3.1 Regional Centre, Noida & New Delhi (RC, Noida & New Delhi)

NIEPID Regional Centre, New Delhi, was established in February 1986 at Kasturba Niketan, Lajpat Nagar-II, New Delhi, to provide the best educational climate where every professional can develop their maximum potential in the field of Intellectual Disability. During 2023-24, the centre conducted three long-term courses approved by RCI, namely:

- M.Ed in Special Education (ID)
- D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD)
- B.Ed. in Special Education (ID)

It also conducts short-term programmes for professionals working in the field of Intellectual Disability every year. In addition to this, the centre provides services to clients having



delayed development/Intellectual Disability. The centre conducts awareness camps and screening camps as part of its extension and outreach activity. The centre also provides technical support to local NGOs working in the field of Intellectual Disability. The centre had set up “ANKUR”, an Early Intervention Centre, in 1990 for providing services to children below 5 yrs of age. RC, New Delhi also extends its support to students from different professional colleges for their internships. RC, New Delhi had shifted its activities to its permanent building at Noida in February 2015.

#### **1.4.3.2 Regional Centre, Kolkata (RC, Kolkata)**

NIEPID Regional Centre, Kolkata, was established in March 1986 in the National Institute for the Locomotor Disability campus, Bonhooghly, B.T.Road, Kolkata- 700090. During 2023-24, the centre conducted five long-term courses approved by RCI, namely:

- M.Ed in Special Education (ID)
- B.Ed. in Special Education (ID)
- B.Ed in Special Education (ID – Open Distance Learning(ODL)
- D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD)
- Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (ID)

The centre conducts short term training programmes for professionals and parents every year. There is a special clinic for early identification and intervention for the child’s overall development for children at risk of Intellectual Disability. Services in special education, psychology, vocational training and early intervention are provided in the centre.

Placement of students is allowed for undergraduate and postgraduate students from the areas related to the field of Intellectual Disability. The centre conducts awareness camps and screening camps apart from its extension and outreach activity. The centre also provides technical support to NGOs working in the field of Intellectual Disability.

#### **1.4.3.3 Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai (RC, Navi Mumbai)**

NIEPID, Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai, was started on the campus of Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for the Speech and Hearing Disabilities, Mumbai, in the year 1987. This centre was established to cater to the needs of the Western Region, covering the states of Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Goa, Lakshadweep and Daman & Diu. To ensure the expansion of activities, the Centre was shifted to Navi Mumbai in the year 2004. The centre is now providing services from the new building located at Plot 44A, Sector 5, Kharghar, Navi Mumbai, which is one of the state-of-art building with complete accessibility features.

In the year 2023-24, the centre conducted five long-term courses, namely:

- M.Ed in Special Education (ID)
- B.Ed. in Special Education (ID)



- D.Ed. in Special Education (IDD)
- Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (ID)
- Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (ID)

The centre offers services in Special Education, Psychology, Speech & Language and Occupational Therapy to persons with Intellectual Disability. Short-term programmes, Parent Training Programmes, Awareness programmes and IQ Assessment Camps are conducted through this centre. The services offered by the centre includes Psychological assessment, Behaviour Management, Parent Counselling, Early Intervention Special Education Assessment and Intervention, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Vocational Assessment, Skill Training, Family cottage, etc.

#### **1.4.3.4 NIEPID Model Special Education Centre, Noida**

NIEPID Model Special Education Centre (MSEC) was established in 1964 by Govt. of India at Kasturba Niketan, Lajpat Nagar-II, New Delhi - 110024. The centre was started to provide specialized and comprehensive services to persons with Intellectual Disabilities. The centre has been functioning under NIEPID since 1986. The school is equipped with qualified professionals providing quality services to persons with Intellectual Disability.

The centre extends its support in providing education and training to empower persons with Intellectual Disability. The school has both residential and day care facility. The service activities include psychological assessment, parent counselling, home-based training. The centre also conducts short-term training programmes for professionals, parents and sibling training programmes. Students from other organizations and institutes are placed in the centre for training. The centre also conducts regular curricular and co-curricular activities for the children enrolled at the centre. NIEPID-MSEC was shifted to its permanent building at Noida in February 2015 while retaining the existing school facility at Lajpat Nagar- New Delhi through online mode. The MSEC also started Inclusive set up where typically developing children are given admission along with children with ID / other developmental disabilities for inclusion of the Children with ID / developmental disabilities into the society.

#### **1.4.3.5 Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Personswith Disabilities (CRC), Davanagere**

NIEPID had initiated the setting up of CRC at Davanagere in Karnataka State in March 2017. Composite Regional Centre (CRC), Davanagere is a service modality under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2017. CRC, Davanagere creates resources and infrastructure required for developing services for persons with disabilities in the State of Karnataka. The institute thrives on empowering Persons with Disabilities to realize their fullest potential and participate equally in all aspects of life.

The new building of CRC Davanagere constructed at Vaddanahalli, Davanagere was



virtually inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2024.

In the year 2023-24, the centre conducted two long-term courses, namely:

- D. Ed in Special Education (IDD)
- D. Ed in Special Education (HI)

#### **1.4.3.6 Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Personswith Disabilities (CRC), Nellore**

NIEPID established Composite Regional Centre at Nellore, Andhra Pradesh on 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2016. CRC is an extended arm of the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (Divyangjan) under the administrative control of the Department of Empowerment Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India. All the therapeutic and rehabilitation services are being provided to PWDs since day one. The team consisting of Medical professionals, Psychologists, Special Educators, Therapeutic Experts (Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physiotherapy), Early Interventionists, Orientation & Mobility Instructors, Prosthetic & Orthotic Engineers, vocational counsellors, Trainers and Rehabilitation Officers provide services to the PWDs.

In the year 2023-24, the centre conducted one long-term course, namely:

- D. Ed in Special Education (HI)

#### **1.4.3.7 Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Personswith Disabilities (CRC), Rajnandgaon**

The Composite Regional Centre, Rajnandgaon, is an extension of the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disability (NIEPID) Secunderabad. It was established on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2016 to extend services that cater to multiple and diverse disabilities under one roof. The administrative control of the centre was transferred to NIEPID w.e.f 1<sup>st</sup> May 2020. Today, it is fully equipped and functional to provide rehabilitative and educational services to all types of disabilities. It is located at Old Hospital Campus Rajnandgaon, CRC offers end-to-end solutions for the Divyangjan in Chhattisgarh. Its services range from academic to clinical and the centre is committed for the cause of the Divyangjan. Persons having different disabilities served by CRC include persons with Locomotor Disability, Blindness, Low-vision, Hearing Impairment, Intellectual Disability, Mental Illness, Leprosy Cured, Cerebral Palsy, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and Multiple Disabilities of all ages. Particular emphasis is given to early intervention. The new building of CRC Rajnandgaon constructed at Thakurtola, Rajnandgaon was virtually inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2024.

In the year 2023-24, the centre conducted one long-term course, namely:

- D. Ed in Special Education (IDD)



## Chapter 2

# Human Resource Development

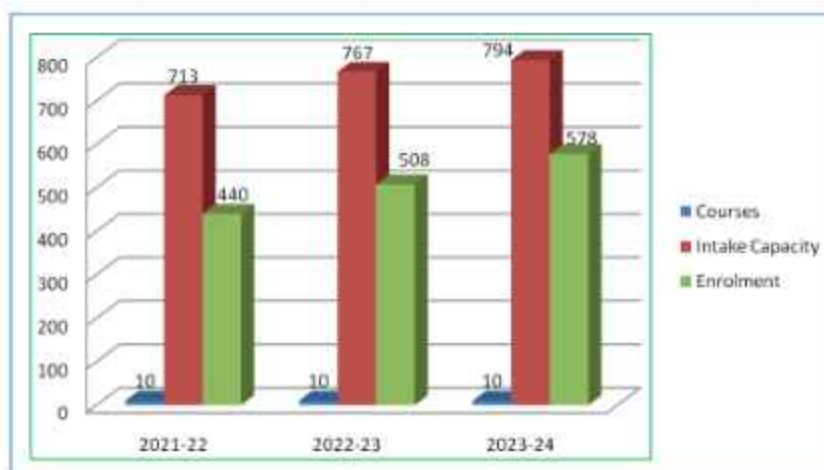
Human Resource Development aims to achieve the most crucial objective of competency development and capacity building at all levels. As one of its prime objectives, NIEPID is engaged in a continuous process of competency development in people and creating trained human resources through its HRD programmes to enhance the growth of individuals with disabilities. The policies and programmes of the institute are designed to support and sustain opportunities for continuing acquisition of knowledge, skills, attitudes and competencies which are beneficial to the individual and the society. In human resource development, the primary activities are to conduct long-term and short-term courses, training, workshops and continuing education programmes for professional enculturation. NIEPID organizes national level programmes for professionals, parents and persons with Intellectual Disability on important, relevant themes to build awareness and penetrative thinking in intellectual disability.

### 2.1 Long-term Courses

In order to promote human resource development, NIEPID is conducting 10 long-term training programmes (4 Diploma courses, 2 Graduate, 3 Post Graduate courses, which include 1 M.Phil programme and CBID course (6 months)) approved by the Rehabilitation Council of India at the Institute's headquarters and its regional centres. These courses are identified and developed as per the need felt in this area. NIEPID conducted 10 long-term training programmes in the year 2023-24. A total of 578 candidates against the strength of 794 were enrolled for the year 2023-24 in different courses at NIEPID HQs, and its regional centres along with CRCs and the details of enrolment (course-wise) are presented in **Table 2a**.

## 2.2 Description of the Academic Programmes

### 2.2.1 M.Phil. in Rehabilitation Psychology

This is a two-year academic course affiliated to Osmania University, Hyderabad. This course is designed to create rehabilitation psychologists of the highest cadre who will train master trainers and conduct research in psychological aspects to provide comprehensive services to persons with Intellectual Disability and other disabilities.

### 2.2.2 M.Ed. Special Education (ID)

M.Ed. Special Education (ID) course of two-year duration, conducted at HQ is affiliated to Osmania University, Hyderabad, aims at developing professionals at faculty level in special education. The courses at Regional Centre, Kolkata affiliated to West Bengal State University, Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University and Regional Centre Noida affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi.

### 2.2.3 Postgraduate Diploma in Early Intervention

Children with developmental delay show significant improvement if they are detected early and professional services rendered at an early age. These services are trans-disciplinary in nature and holistic in approach covering child development, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and family intervention. This one year course is affiliated to Osmania University, Hyderabad.

### 2.2.4 B.Ed. in Special Education (ID)

Keeping in view the need for special teachers at various levels, NIEPID is conducting a two-year B.Ed. in Special Education (ID) at its headquarters affiliated to Osmania University, Regional Centre, Kolkata affiliated to West Bengal State University, Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University and Regional Centre Noida affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi.

### 2.2.5 Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Intellectual Disability)

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) focuses on children below six years of age and has various modes and approaches in imparting training based on the target group's ability. This demands human resource training to reach out to the families by being a home visitor or itinerant teacher, to manage children with disabilities in regular or special pre-schools. One year Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education course is offered at NIEPID, Secunderabad, and Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai.

### 2.2.6 D.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities)

This two-year diploma course aims at preparing special teachers, who are competent in screening, assessment, education and training of children with Intellectual Disability and associated disabilities. The course is offered at NIEPID, Secunderabad, Regional Centre Kolkata, Regional Centre Noida, Regional Centre Navi Mumbai, CRC Rajnandgaon and CRC Davanagere.



### 2.2.7 Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (Intellectual Disability)

This one-year diploma course aims to prepare Vocational Instructors for imparting Vocational Training for Persons with in Intellectual Disability. The course is offered at NIEPID, Secunderabad, Regional Centre Kolkata and Regional Centre Navi Mumbai.

### 2.2.8 B.Ed. Special Education (ID) - ODL

NIEPID, RC, Kolkata has started two years and six months or Five Semester B.Ed. Special Education (ID)– Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Programme affiliated to Netaji Subhas Open University, Kolkata and recognised by Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi from the academic year 2020-21. The total intake capacity of the programme is 50 per year, the successful candidates of this B.Ed. Special Education Programme will be able to obtain a “Registered Professional Certificate” from the Rehabilitation Council of India to work as teachers in special education.

### 2.2.9 D.Ed. Special Education (Hearing Impairment)

This two-year diploma course aims at preparing special teachers, who are competent in screening, assessment, education and training of children with hearing impairment and associated disabilities and is offered at CRC Nellore and CRC Davanagere.

### 2.2.10 Community Based Inclusive Development (CBID)

This programme is designed to develop community based professionals for the promotion of Inclusivity in the society through field base support for Persons with Disabilities. This is a 6 months programme recognized by RCI and Monash University, Australia.

## 2.3 Short-term Training Programmes and Webinars

The short-term training programmes (STP)/Webinars are essentially designed as in-service training for professionals and personnel working in the field of rehabilitation for persons with Intellectual Disability. During 2023-24, the Institute conducted 258 (including webinars at RCs and CRCs) short-term training programmes/webinars, benefiting 25,089 professionals. The programme versus professionals’ ratio is as follows:

## Chapter 3

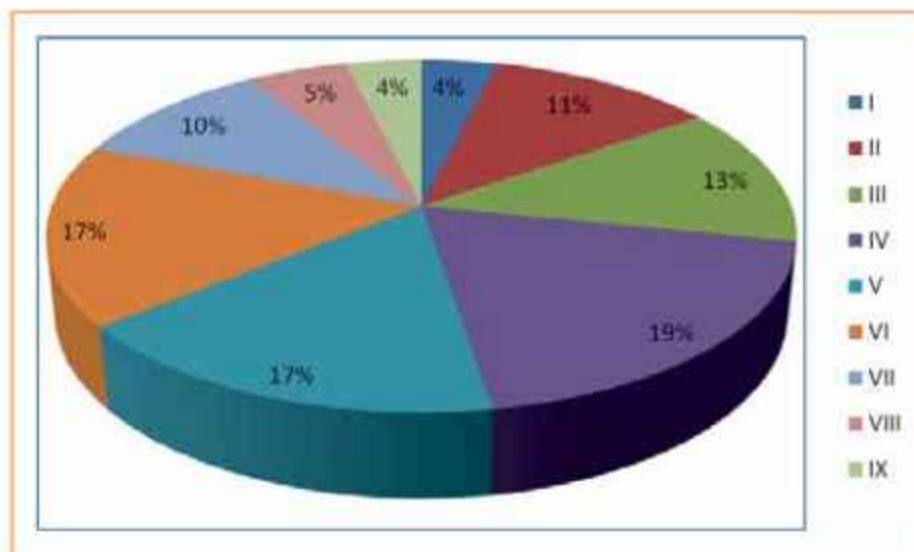
### Research and Development

Research and Development is one of the crucial objectives of NIEPID. An analysis of the R & D Projects completed at NIEPID during the last 40 years reveals that the central focus of the R & D has been in applied research. Considering the research requirement in the field, proposals are presented and approved by designated committees such as the Academic Committee and Ethics Committee of the Institute before initiating the project. The proposals are initially discussed at the Departmental level and regular faculty meet level before submitting them to the Academic Committee. Further, all the R&D projects are submitted for the approval of the Ethics Committee of NIEPID. So far, 78 research projects have been completed in collaboration with various national and international agencies such as US- India Rupee Fund, UNICEF, UNDP, ICSSR and S&T Mission Mode, and the Projects funded by the Institute. The outcome of the completed Research Projects is as follows:

### 3.1 Research Projects (2023-24):

During the year 2023-24, three projects have been completed and three projects are ongoing. Four new research proposals were submitted to the Central Sector Scheme on Research and Development, DEPwD, MSJ&E for funding approval. The status of the research projects is presented in **Table-3b**.

#### 3.1.1 Description of the Completed Research Project:

##### I. Development of an Indian Test of Intelligence - Phase – II

Development of Indian Test of Intelligence (DITI) was initiated under the Central Sector Scheme on “Research on Disability Related Technology, Products and Issues, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt of India has approved the project to Develop an Indian Test of Intelligence for Assessment of Persons with Intellectual Disability for issuance of Disability Certificate.

The Objective of this project was to develop an Indian Test of Intelligence which is specific to Indian culture.

The Rationale for this project was as follows:

- Available tests are either adaptations of older Versions of Western Tests or Not standardised on Indian Population covering wide range of socio-cultural differences.
- Recent trends in intellectual assessment both in India & worldwide suggest that most of the existing tests reflect gaps in informational, technological and global advancement that would have impacted the current age population.
- Hence, the need for a new approach to science of intelligence testing.
- Need for an Indigenous tool was long anticipated but not taken up



### The project deliverables are given below:

- a. A Standardized NIEPID Indian Test of Intelligence tool has been developed which was inaugurated by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Honorable Cabinet minister of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India as the make of India Initiative on 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2023.
- b. It has been notified in the Gazette of India on 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2024 to assess the IQ.
- c. As per the guidelines by ministry, NIEPID is training all the RCI Registered Rehabilitation/Clinical Psychologist in this tool. As per now, ten CRE workshops have been conducted and approx. 500 professionals have already been trained all over India in using this test.

## 2. Promoting Self- Determination for independent living

Self-determination is a concept reflecting the belief that individuals have the right to direct their own lives. People with intellectual disabilities who have self-determination skills have stronger chances of success in transitioning to adulthood, including employment and independence. Self-determination is the ability of individuals to control their lives, achieve self-defined goals, and participate fully in society. Furthermore, this independence could be developed through Self-directed IEP. It intends to promote the active participation of children with intellectual disabilities in assessment, planning, intervention, and evaluation to develop self-determination skills. This study will try to find out the effect of self-directed IEP in developing Self Determination among adults with Intellectual Disability. It will also reflect the practical applicability of Self Determination in the Indian context/ environment.

### The objectives of the project were as follows –

- a. To find the effectiveness of SDIEP in developing self-determination skills in adults with Intellectual disability.
- b. Construction of Independent living scale.
- c. To study the effectiveness of self-determination skills for Independent living in adults with Intellectual disability.
- d. To find a comparative impact of conventional and Self Directed IEP (SDIEP) in adult with Intellectual Disability.

### Project Outcome:

- a. Determine effect of SDIEP in developing self-determination for independent living in adults with Intellectual Disability.
- b. Manual for promoting self-determination skills in adults with Intellectual Disability.
- c. Assessment Tool for Independent Living.



### 3. Impact of early intervention on infants and toddlers with global developmental delays.

The first three years of life is considered a “critical period” in a child’s life. The sensory experiences, stimulation & language exposure during this period may determine synaptogenesis, myelination & neuronal connectivity. The brain develops by “experience-dependent” forces where experiences activate specific pathways in the brain, thereby organizing the brain’s structure & creating the foundations for all subsequent development & behaviour. The principle is “use it or lose it” & “use it & grow it”. Early Intervention provides continuous multidisciplinary services to infants from birth throughout the first three years of life. It means interventional therapy specified for babies at risk for developmental delay & periodic developmental assessment of all the developmental areas as most of the brain development takes place in the first two years of life.

#### The objectives of the project were as follows –

- a. To study the impact of early intervention on the overall development in infants and toddlers with Global Developmental delay.
- b. To compare the development in various domains as a result of early intervention in Down’s syndrome and cerebral palsy.
- c. To study the socio economic and demographic variables effecting impact of Early Intervention

#### Project Outcome:

- a. Early intervention in Infants & toddlers through planned home based programme has given service providers like parents a better understanding of importance of early intervention therapies in children with Global Developmental Delay in Down syndrome and Cerebral palsy.
- b. Children with Down syndrome have higher improvement than children with Cerebral palsy in home based programmes.
- c. Severity of Cerebral palsy along with seizures and antenatal risk factors might have hampered the outcome in Down syndrome also.

#### 3.1.2 Description of the Ongoing Research Projects:

##### 1. A study on the association between visual, motor, perception and cognitive abilities of children with disabilities.

As per the review of literature it has been found that there is a paucity of research in this area especially in India. This study will raise the issue of paucity knowledge on visual motor skills in children with specific learning disability. During the last century professional’s knowledge in this field have been increased about specific learning disabilities, but in clarifying causes of this disabilities area remain greater shortage of information, and research in this field. We are attempting to find the answer of the question that there is any relationship or association with visual motor gestalt development and the cognitive abilities of the children with SLD.





Visual motor skill will be measured with Bender's Visual motor Gestalt Test and several cognitive components with Malin's Intelligence Scale for Indian children will be used (Malin,1969).

The main objective of the present study is to determine relationship between visual motor perception as a basic psychological process and cognitive function of children with SLD. This study will determine the relationship between errors in visual motor perception with Bender Gestalt test and cognitive functions with MISIC among children with SLD and normal controls (without SLD).

## 2. Development of Academic Achievement Test for Specific Learning Disabilities – A Tool for Educators

The rationale of the study: In the recent gazette 2018 passed by the government of India has notified that diagnosis of SLD requires a team approach which includes three steps.

- **Step 1- Assessment of paediatrician:** The paediatrician will do the initial assessment. This will involve a detailed neurological examination including vision and hearing assessment. It has to be ensured that the child has normal visual acuity and hearing before proceeding to next step.
- **Step 2: IQ Assessment:** Child/ clinical psychologist will do the IQ assessment using MISIC or WISC III. If the IQ is determined to be >85, then step 3 will be applied.
- **Step 3- SLD Assessment:** This would involve application of specific psychometric tests for diagnosing SLD and giving it a severity scale.

The gazette notification has emphasized the team members for certification of SLD should include paediatrician to conduct the neurological assessment, Rehabilitation/Clinical psychologist to conduct IQ assessment and occupational therapist or Special educator/teacher trained for assessment of SLD.

Aim of the the present research aims at developing a comprehensive Academic Achievement Test for SLD to be used by teachers to identify children with SLD in the school going age.

## 3. Exact causes for high number of Divyangjan having intellectual and developmental infirmities in the state of UP, Telangana, Bihar & West Bengal

As per 2011 CENSUS, the highest number of disabled persons is from the State of Uttar Pradesh. Nearly 50% of the disabled persons belonged to one of the five States namely Uttar Pradesh (15.5%), Maharashtra (11.05%), Bihar (8.69%), United Andhra Pradesh (8.45%), and West Bengal (7.52%). The primary aim of this study is to identify the exact causes/reasons for a high number of intellectual and developmental disabilities among children in the states of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, West Bengal, and United Andhra Pradesh.



The key objectives are:

- a. To determine the prevalence of prenatal, perinatal, and postnatal causes of Intellectual and Developmental Infirmities (IDI) among children in these study areas.
- b. To investigate the association between various sociodemographic factors (e.g., maternal age, socioeconomic status, parental consanguinity etc.,) and the occurrence of IDI in these states.
- c. To provide evidence-based recommendations for the prevention, early detection, and management of IDI based on the identified etiological factors and healthcare gaps.

### **3.1.3 New Projects Approved**

The EC has approved the following 4 new projects. These proposals were submitted to Ministry for seeking funds under the Central Sector Scheme of Research and Development.

1. Development of Adaptive Behaviour Assessment Instrument for Indian Population.
2. Development of Indigenous Augmented Mobile Application (I-AMMA) in Indian languages to facilitate Communication of Persons with Intellectual Disability
3. Mortality among Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities in India
4. Development of Computer Based Screening Test for Adults with Specific Learning Disabilities

## Chapter 4

### General Services

#### 4.1 Services

Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (PwID) generally need a plethora of services to make them functionally as independent as possible and improve their quality of life. NIEPID provides a spectrum of service delivery systems for the rehabilitation of persons with Intellectual Disabilities. It is common practice to use a multi-disciplinary approach to provide comprehensive services relevant to the individual needs of PwID.

NIEPID has evolved its extension of services based on life cycle approach encompassing infants, children, youth and adults as indicated below:

- Early identification, Early Intervention and Prevention of Disabilities
- Minimization of the adverse effect of developmental delays and acceleration of the rate of development of children
- Preschool Education
- Special Education Programmes
- Vocational Training and Job placement
- Independent living skills

The services are also focused on persons with severe and profound Intellectual Disability in the unit named 'Manoranjanam' and a Multi-Sensory Unit that offers intense sensory stimulations for children with profound and multiple disabilities.

#### 4.2 General Services

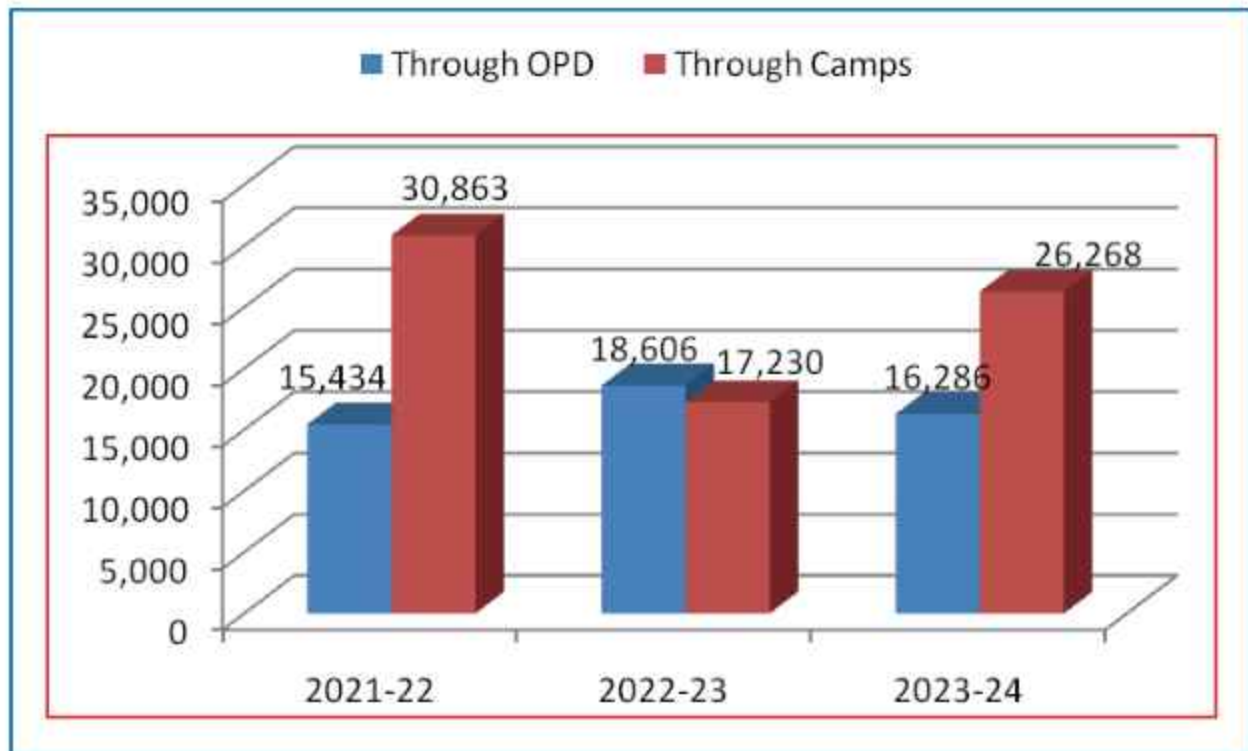
The Institute provides assessment and evaluation services through case history taking, physical and medical examinations, intellectual and developmental assessment, special educational assessment, therapeutic needs assessment, vocational assessment and essential biochemical screening and examination. After a comprehensive assessment, a management plan and intervention packages are developed. Parental counselling is done to provide emotional support by explaining the nature of the child's condition and his/her level of functioning. A home-based training programme and demonstration for the same are given to parents for management and rehabilitation.

During 2023-24, 16,286 New clients were registered at NIEPID, Secunderabad and its Regional Centres located in New Delhi/Noida, Kolkata and Navi Mumbai. In addition, 26,268 new clients were assessed through outreach camps for the distribution of TLM kits.

The details of services provided to new clients during the year 2023-24 are shown in **Table 4a.**

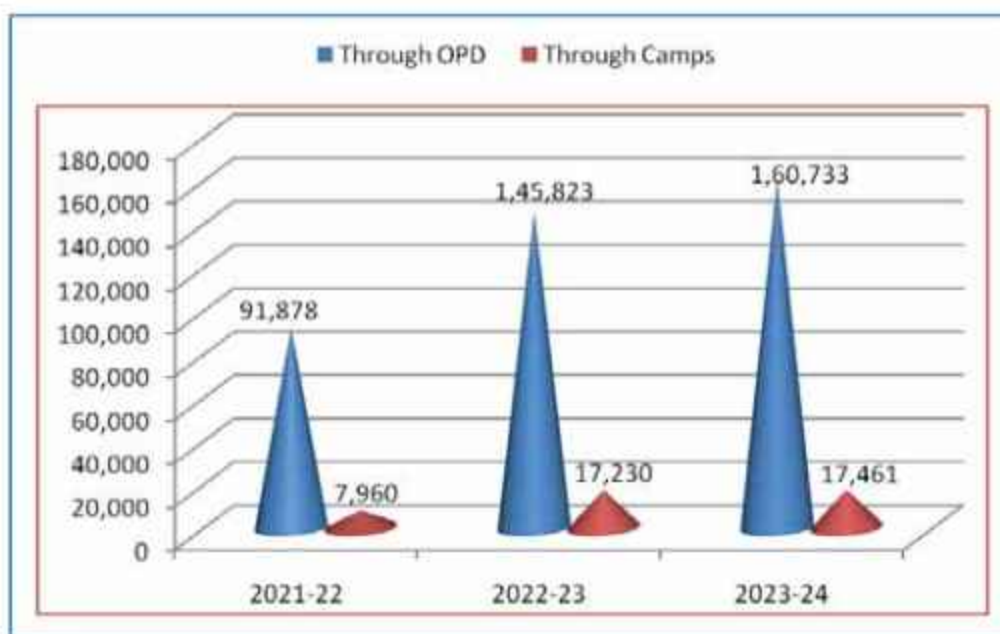
### 4.2.1 Follow up services

Follow up services aim at augmenting home-based training by developing management plans for implementation at home. For persons coming from outstation, family cottage facility is made available. Wherever necessary, appropriate referrals are provided to the clients to seek services from the local institutions while the periodic consultation at NIEPID continues. The backup support to special services is provided through direct training, supply of folders, posters and books published by the Institute for information and guidance of parents and family members at a nominal cost.

During the year 2023-24 a total of 1,60,733 follow up clients were given support (special services at NIEPID (**Table 4f**). In addition, 17,461 follow up clients were provided services and TLM kits were distributed through various camps conducted under outreach programmes (**Table 4d**) Altogether a total of 4,57,606 support services were provided to both new and follow up clients (**Table 4e**).

### 4.3 Types of Services provided:

#### 4.3.1 Medical Services

Clients registered at NIEPID are taken up for detailed case history and clinical examination for general health assessment and diagnosis. Medical management is individualized and need-based and includes imparting information and treatment for co-morbid conditions like epilepsy, hyperkinetic behavioral problems, nutritional deficiencies, infections, hormonal deficiencies and mental illnesses.

Drugs are provided for epilepsy, hyperkinesia, mental illnesses and for other comorbid medical conditions free of cost to clients belonging to families of low income. Consultant medical doctors such as Neurology, Orthopedic, Endocrinology, Dental, Ophthalmology, Homeopathy and Genetic services are outsourced. Appropriate referrals are also made wherever necessary.

#### 4.3.2 Early Intervention Services (CDEIC)

The functioning of separate CDEIC Unit was established in for catering the needs of children below the age of 6 years. It is operationalized unit for providing services to all types of disabilities. Early Intervention Services (EIS) cater to children aged 0-6 years who are at risk or have developmental delays. These services focus on prevention, remediation and treatment to foster all-around development. The services offered are child-centered and family-oriented and provided by a multi-disciplinary team of experts. The child receives individualized intervention consisting of physiotherapy, Psychology, occupational therapy, speech and language intervention, medical, psycho-social and family intervention. EIS also offer parent training programmes, group therapy, play therapy, guidance and counselling. Ophthalmology services have also been initiated at CDEIC unit during 2022-23.



#### 4.3.3 Physiotherapy Services

This unit caters to persons with Intellectual Disabilities with associated motor problems such as cerebral palsy, abnormal motor patterns, movement disorders, loco-motor





abnormalities and congenital abnormalities. After a detailed assessment, intervention Programmes are planned to meet individualized needs. Therapeutic interventions are of eclectic nature that includes exercises, hydrotherapy, postures, and gait training to enhance overall development.

#### 4.3.4 Occupational Therapy

The Occupational Therapy unit caters to the needs of persons with Intellectual Disabilities, associated conditions and other pervasive developmental disorders. This service mainly addresses developing performance components, improving specific sensory, motor, cognitive-perceptual skills and promoting independent living. Clients requiring services are taken up for a detailed evaluation, and a specific



intervention programme is developed according to the individual needs. Those in need of assistive and adaptive devices are guided to appropriate centres. Necessary guidance and support are provided for the caretakers to continue the intervention at home.

#### 4.3.5 Biochemistry Services

At NIEPID, medical services are supported by the facility of a Biochemistry Laboratory to carry out biochemical investigations (Metabolic screening) to identify biochemical or metabolic disorders related to Intellectual Disability such as amino acid disorders, glycogen storage disorders and mucopolysaccharidoses and routine biochemical tests to check general health that can support diagnosis, treatment, counselling and monitoring.



#### 4.3.6 Speech Pathology and Audiology Services

Delayed development of speech and language is one of the significant features of Intellectual Disability. Many children also have hearing defects of various natures. Those clients requiring services are taken up for detailed assessment. A speech and language intervention package is developed to meet the individual needs. Parents are guided to carry out the intervention at home under the advice of professionals.

#### 4.3.7 Electromyography

Electro-myelography (EMG) records the electrical changes in the nerve potentials. It gives information about the functioning of sensory and motor nerve status of persons with Intellectual Disability. It helps to determine if the reflex mechanism is intact or interrupted and to identify the functioning of the nerves, spinal cord and brain. Based on the result of the EMG, the therapy programme is designed on which the nerve sensation, functioning of muscles and joint movement is identified. Accordingly, therapy can be given by exciting sensation activity of nerves. Repetition of sensory mechanism will help to regain sensation if there is a loss and reduced sensation. If there is damage at the motor nerve spinal levels, muscle contraction can be enhanced by repeating the reflex mechanism. Repeated muscle contraction helps to develop muscle power, which in turn will assist in developing joint stability.

#### 4.3.8 Electroencephalogram

The Electroencephalogram (EEG) is an essential procedure used for understanding the physiology of the brain. It helps identify the pathological changes seen in the structure and function of different areas of the brain. The main objective of the procedure is to diagnose the types of seizures and various epileptic syndromes. EEG is an essential procedure of a comprehensive diagnostic workup of persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities having neurological deficits. EEG



is also used to assess or monitor the effectiveness of the treatment. It helps in deciding the type and duration of the medication to be used for epilepsy. The prevalence of epilepsy among persons with Intellectual Disability is high (30%) compared to the average population (1%).



### 4.3.9 Services for Persons with Multiple Disabilities

Children with Intellectual Disability having additional problems such as hearing impairment, visual impairment and physical impairment are provided special attention through this service. A team of multidisciplinary professionals provide comprehensive services. A special clinic for orthopedic services is available once a week.

### 4.3.10 Nutrition

All cases registered at NIEPID are assessed for nutritional status using anthropometric measurements (height and weight). Those cases identified as 'undernourished' are provided nutritional advice.

### 4.3.11 Hydrotherapy Services

Hydrotherapy is a mode of treatment for persons with Intellectual Disability, particularly those suffering from joint pains, swelling, stiffness, muscle weakness, and spasticity. The Institute provides hydrotherapy services to persons with Intellectual Disability having various physical problems. A state of Art Hydrotherapy Unit is being establishing in NIEPID HQ and construction of Unit is under progress.

### 4.3.12 Special Education Services

Children with Intellectual Disability are assessed for the current level of functioning in various skills such as self-help skills, gross and fine motor skills, functional reading and writing skills, time, money and related cognitive skills. Parents are involved throughout special education services such as assessment, planning of an Individualized Educational Program (IEP), and the implementation of IEP. Various teaching-learning materials and adaptive materials appropriate to the Indian context are utilized during the training. Computer-Assisted Training Modules are also utilized for children with special needs to enhance their learning.

### 4.3.13 "MANORANJANAM" - Resource room for Persons with Profound Intellectual Disability

Though the service programmes for persons with Intellectual Disability have increased over the years, very few organizations offer services to persons with profound intellectual



disabilities. Persons with profound intellectual disabilities require more specialized services and personnel to train them because most of them suffer from associated physical disabilities, and some even have epilepsy. However, research studies on the education of children with profound Intellectual Disabilities indicate that systematic training can make them learn basic skills. This reduces their dependency on others to some extent. Because of this, the Institute has started a unit called “Manoranjanam” to train children with profound Intellectual Disability. This is an outcome of one of the institute’s research projects, Teaching Children with Profound Mental Retardation.

#### **4.3.14 Autism and Intellectual Disability**

It is estimated that 75% of persons with autism have low levels of intelligence. As children with Intellectual Disability and autism are found in schools for children with Intellectual Disability, appropriate educational services must be provided. Staff trained in managing children with autism is engaged to provide individualized and small group instruction to children with Intellectual Disability and autism. In addition, the staff provides consultancy support to the teachers in the regular schools and special schools.

#### **4.3.15 Intellectual Disability and Sensory Impairments**

Children with Intellectual Disability having sensory impairment in vision and hearing require special education and group training. When both the senses of vision and hearing are impaired in them, the training methods and materials require adaptations. Keeping this in view, exclusive services for such children have been initiated. These children get individualized attention from trained teachers in addition to their classroom experience. Environmental modifications are made to meet their unique needs. Considering the need for services for children with Intellectual Disabilities having sensory impairments, a manual for deaf-blindness was developed by NIEPID in collaboration with Voice and Vision Taskforce, which can be used as a guide for teachers/ service providers.

#### **4.3.16 Computer-Assisted Instruction**

Computer-assisted instruction aims to enhance the academic learning skills of children with Intellectual Disability and teach the children the techniques of computer operation to enable them to use developed software for self-learning.

The Department of Special Education has so far developed six software packages suitable for persons with Intellectual Disability. Regular services are being offered to students of the special education centre and adults with Intellectual Disabilities from the department of independent adult living to orient them to use computers for learning. Multisensory input received through computer-assisted instruction helps sustain the children’s attention and motivation and expedites their learning. Because of neuro-motor problems associated with Intellectual Disability, computer software packages have been developed with adaptations and hardware peripherals to help children with Intellectual Disability.

#### **4.3.17 Group Activity**

Group activity services are provided to children with Intellectual Disability referred from general services till they get regular admission to Special Education Centre. These services are provided in the afternoon for three different age groups.



#### 4.3.18 Psychological Assessment

All clients registered at NIEPID are taken up for psychological assessment, including developmental assessment, intellectual assessment, and adaptive behavior assessment. Batteries of tests are administered to ascertain the level of Intellectual Disability. Based on the assessment, individualized intervention programmes are formulated. Psychological assessment reports are provided for educational and training purposes and to obtain the disability certificate to avail benefits and concessions given to persons with Intellectual Disability by the Government from time to time.



#### 4.3.19 Behaviour Modification Services

Persons with Intellectual Disability having problem behaviours like head banging, self-biting, self-injurious behaviour, excessive crying etc., are offered services of behaviour modification. After a detailed assessment, information on the frequency and severity of behaviour problems, functional analysis is done to determine the factors leading to such behaviours. After this, appropriate behavioral management programmes are developed, and parents are given instructions on suitable interventions in the event of the occurrence of the problem. Follow-up is done at regular intervals to ensure progress.

#### 4.3.20 Parent Counselling Services

Parent counselling is offered by providing emotional support and empathetic understanding to deal with their distress and guilt feelings arising from the presence of the child having an Intellectual Disability. Apart from tackling misconceptions of parents, guidance is also given to understand the nature of Intellectual Disability and the needs of the children at different stages of life to promote the child's harmonious development in the family setting.



#### 4.4 Vocational Training

Department of Adult Independent Living (DAIL) is extending vocational rehabilitation services to adults with Intellectual Disabilities. The main objectives of DAIL are:

- To organize vocational rehabilitation services for adults with Intellectual Disability
- To extend support in the transition periods in all walks of life and promote independent





- living
- To develop Human Resources to extend comprehensive services for persons with Intellectual Disabilities
  - To undertake R&D activities in vocational rehabilitation & independent living of persons with Intellectual Disability.

#### 4.4.1 Workstation for Vocational Training of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities

Department of Adult Independent Living (DAIL) functions to organize skill development programs and extend various vocational services to persons with Intellectual Disability, so that the individuals with Intellectual Disability can excel in their lives. To streamline the process of vocational training, the Department has initiated workstations to have a phase-wise training programme for persons with Intellectual Disabilities. After assessing the clients, a management plan is made to stimulate the cognitive, motor, communication and social functioning and then place them in different workstations. At the workstations, the person with Intellectual Disability has initially been given exposure to varied settings to develop work skills and work behaviour (Generic Skill Training).

After successfully completing training for a period of six months in Generic Skill Training, Specific Skill Training and Independent Skill Training are provided. The trainees are then placed in open/supportive/self-supportive employment after conducting a 'job analysis' which matches the skills acquired by the client with that of the skills required/identified for the job. While on training, efforts are made to identify jobs and intimate the parents or pursue further follow-up. A total of 1,682 adults with Intellectual Disabilities received Vocational Assessment, Guidance and Counselling services during the year. Similarly, 19,699 Adults with intellectual disabilities were given training in various workstations during the year at DAIL, Secunderabad. The details are presented in **Table 4g**.

The by-products of the workstation training include screen printing, photocopying, stationery products (writing pads, file pads, etc.), and offset the institute's use of printing for its internal use. The other by-products, such as greeting cards, glass paintings, soft toys, craft work etc., are being purchased by visitors and staff members and used by the Institute for its requirements such as mementoes to visiting guests, wall decorations etc.

#### **4.4.2 Programme for Transaction Training**

The Department of Adult Independent Living has initiated an innovative training programme termed 'transaction training'. As part of this programme, a portable counter (demo-tent) has been placed inside the campus of NIEPID near general services and adult persons with intellectual disabilities, with the support of parents and trained vocational instructors, carry out various activities of promoting the by-products of the vocational training such as soft toys, art and craft items, greeting cards etc. Through this activity, they are exposed to the basic requirements for marketing, socialization, cash transactions, social skills, communication skills etc.

#### **4.4.3 Vocational Guidance & Information Services (VGIS)**

Vocational Guidance & Information Services (VGIS) is a unique platform for sharing the necessary information to adult persons with intellectual disabilities. Information on new workstations, services available for adult persons with intellectual disabilities for the current year, current trends, schemes and benefits, employment issues etc., are discussed during the meeting.

#### **4.5 Family Cottage Services**

The facility of the family cottage is available for the families coming from far-off places to avail services at NIEPID. There are 12 units of family cottages available at NIEPID, Secunderabad. Each unit can accommodate a family of at least five members. Every unit has an attached kitchenette and a





washroom. While the occupants of the family cottage can opt for the NIEPID canteen facilities being run by parents of a person with Intellectual Disability, facilities such as utensils and cooking gas are also provided in each unit of the family cottage for self-cooking if required by the occupant. The clients occupying the family cottage can stay for two weeks and receive professional services and training such as skill training, individual family counselling, behaviour modification, speech-language therapy, medical advice, physiotherapy, recreational activities, and other help. During their stay at these cottages, parents can concentrate on the needs of the child while being away from their daily routine chores.

The number of occupants of the family cottage during the year 2023-24 was 480. The average duration of the stay for the family was five days per visit. The details of services provided in family cottages are provided in **Table 4h**.

#### 4.6 Parent Training Programmes

The objective of this program is to involve parents in the care, management and training of their children with Intellectual Disability. The program also encourages mutual support among parents and the exchange of ideas and information. During this year **214** parent training programmes were conducted, benefiting **14,275** parents. This also includes parents trained during the master trainers' programme conducted by the Institute.

#### 4.7 Respite Care Services

Respite care is short-term care that helps families having children with Intellectual Disability to take a break from the daily routine and stress. Respite Care also provides an opportunity for persons with Intellectual Disability to stay away from the family for a short period, which may enhance independent living skills. NIEPID started the respite care services with the following objectives:

- To provide an opportunity to parents/family members to get respite time in order to fulfil other responsibilities.
- To create an opportunity for parents to get relief from the stress of routine care of persons with Intellectual Disability.
- To provide a short stay from home for persons with Intellectual Disability.



- To serve as a demonstration centre for practical exposure for the students undergoing various academic training programmes at NIEPID.

Separate facilities are provided for males and females with zero rejection as the norm to be admitted to the respite care centre. A trained special educator and aayah support each facility during the daytime. Additional facilities like leisure activities, sports, cocurricular activities are taken care of using the existing recourse. The children are included for a short period in the school activities and DAIL for engaging them in meaningful activities. The parents/family members of persons with Intellectual Disability are utilizing these services for their children for a short stay lasting up to 5 days, which is extended in exceptional cases. A total of 3,748 (new and follow up) PwIDs have utilized the services of Respite Care Centre during the year 2023-24. The details are given in **Table 4i**.

#### 4.8 Feedback from the Clients on NIEPID General Services

As part of the efforts to refine the services offered, NIEPID obtains feedback from its clients. An analysis of the feedback received from **195** Clients/Parents during the year revealed that 81.3% of the clients are satisfied with the services offered at NIEPID, and the details are given in **Table 4j**.

The satisfactory level of services provided by the professionals (Sl.No.1-19) is 82.6%, whereas the satisfactory level of services provided to the clients by students attending various long-term training programmes under the supervision of faculty and guest faculty is found to be 77.8% (Sl.No.20-a-g). Suggestion boxes and complaint registers are also maintained at the service providing areas, apart from the feedback format given below. Appropriate actions are taken to provide required comforts to the clients concerning NIEPID services.

## Chapter 5

### Department of Rehabilitation Psychology

Department of Rehabilitation Psychology (DRP) is involved in human resource development, research and development, services and extension & outreach programmes. Services offered by the department are developmental assessment, intellectual assessment, behavioural assessment, parent/family counselling, behaviour modification and cognitive training.

As part of the HRD program, the department conducts M.Phil Program in Rehabilitation Psychology affiliated to Osmania University with extensive theoretical inputs and supervised clinical practice to impart necessary professional skills to practice independently in disability rehabilitation. The department also conducted 10 short-term training programs with 800 professionals, and 01 Webinar was conducted benefiting 200 professionals. The details of STPs are provided in **table 5a**.

The department conducts research in the field of Intellectual Disability. During 2023-24 the department has completed one research project, namely, '*Development of an Indian Test of Intelligence*'. This is one of the first Indian made test in the field of Assessment of Intelligence. The test developed will be helpful in the assessment of the intellectual level of persons with Intellectual Disability so that they can avail government concessions and social benefits. The project results can also be used for planning intervention programs based on strengths and weaknesses found in an individual. Project is completed and ready to use.

#### Psychological Assessment

All clients registered at NIEPID are taken up for psychological assessment, including developmental assessment, intellectual assessment, adaptive behavior and specific learning disability assessment. Psychological assessment reports are provided for educational and training purposes and to obtain the disability certificate to avail benefits and concessions given to Persons with Intellectual Disability by the Government from time to time.

#### Behaviour Modification Services

Persons with Intellectual Disability having problem behaviours like head banging, self-biting, self-injurious behaviour, excessive crying and alike are offered services of behaviour modification.

#### Parent Counselling Services

Parent counseling is offered by providing emotional support and empathetic understanding to deal with their distress and guilt feelings arising from the presence of the child having an Intellectual Disability. It also helps them to understand their role in rehabilitation & empowerment of their child with disabilities.

## Chapter 6

### Department of Special Education

In accordance with the institute's objectives, the Department of Special Education (DSE) gets involved in services, Human Resource Development, Research & Development, and Documentation & Dissemination. Extension & Outreach programmes are also part of departmental activities undertaken by the staff. Education and training programmes are organized for the clients attending services at NIEPID. Parental involvement is considered to be the base for the education and training of PwID. Thus, after assessing the clients, parents are explained about the condition, current functioning level of the child, and the strategies for implementing the programme as home-based activity. At the request of parents, educational reports are prepared and issued to the parents.

#### 6.1 Human Resource Development:

To meet the requirement of the trained human resources in disability rehabilitation, the department conducts different long-term programmes and keeps the professional updated with the latest development in the field, and various short-term programmes are conducted. Currently, the department conducts four long term programmes, namely;

- M.Ed. Special Education (ID) – 2 years
- B.Ed. Special Education (ID) – 2 years
- D.Ed. Special Education (IDD) – 2 years
- Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (ID)- 1 year

During the year 2023-24, 16 STPs were conducted benefiting 1,419 professionals, and 01 Webinar was conducted benefiting 98 professionals. The details of short-term programs and services offered are presented in **Table 6a** and **6b** respectively.

#### 6.2 Research & Development:

To improve the teaching-learning process for persons with ID and based on the current need, the department undertakes applied research in the field and documents the findings for dissemination of the information. Several publications and teaching-learning materials (TLM) are the outcomes of the research undertaken by the department; worth mentioning is the Computer Assisted Instruction (CAI) package. Different service units (Manoranjanam, MSI unit, CAI lab) setups in **special education centre** are also the result of R&D projects. Special education centre serves as a lab school for the long-term course trainees where the trainees get exposure to handling students with intellectual disability. In addition to the above activities, the Department of Special Education also supports the institute in implementing various schemes and programmes of the Ministry such as ADIP, DDRS, RCI inspections, Northeast programmes.





The faculties in the Department has submitted research proposals to DEPwD and following proposals has been approved and initiated the research work.

- 1) Development of Academic Achievement Test of Specific Learning Disabilities – A Comprehensive Tool for Educators – Dr. Ambady K.G. (Principal Investigator)
- 2) Development of Computer Based Screening Test for Adults with Specific Learning Disabilities - Dr. Ambady K.G. (Co-Investigator)
- 3) Development of Adaptive Behaviour Assessment Instrument for Indian Population (ABAI) - Dr. Ambady K.G. (Co-Investigator)

### 6.3 Special Education Centre

Special Education Centre (SEC) serves as a lab school for the training programmes of human resource development of the Institute. It is attached to the Department of Special Education. The Centre has an enrolment of 127 children in the age range of 3 years to 18 years, including children with varying degrees of Intellectual Disability ranging from mild to profound levels. Twelve (12) classroom facilities range from early childhood special education to pre-vocational training. In addition to these, four exclusive service units for the education of children with additional disabilities such as autism, multi-sensory impairment, profound intellectual disability, and open basic education programmes have been established to see that children with all levels and combinations of Intellectual Disability are admitted to the school, and the students undergoing various long-term academic programmes will have an opportunity to deal with various problems of Intellectual Disability. In addition to regular classes, group activity services are provided for the new clients referred from general services. Such clients do not get admission for regular services in SEC. These students attend the services on appointments given by the classroom teacher as per the child’s need and the parent’s convenience. The service



activities provided in SEC are given in **Table 6c**, and 07 Short-Term Training programs conducted by SEC Teachers are presented in **Table 6d**.

- As per the almanac of SEC, class-wise IEP meetings with the parents were conducted three times a year.
- Conducted annual sports for students of SEC on the occasion of the 40<sup>th</sup> Annual Day of NIEPID.
- SEC celebrated Festivals in online mode like Ganesh Chaturthi, Dussehra, Diwali, Christmas & Sankranti. Students from SEC and their parents, siblings participated in these celebrations enthusiastically.
- Conducted Yoga online classes throughout the year for the SEC students.
- SEC students participated in Quizable India programme, Gardening competition, special Olympics winter games, Yoga day celebration, Sign language day, Unified sports, Fashion show & Children's day sports activities.

### 6.4 Resource Room for Open Basic Education coaching for NIOS Examination

The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) has started the “Open Basic Education Programme through Regular & Distance Education Mode” and has accredited centres throughout the country. Many children with mild Intellectual Disability and borderline intelligence do not have access to education facilities as they do not fit into the special school system and face difficulty coping with regular educational demands.

These children benefit from the “Open Basic Education” programme under NIOS because of the simplified, phased-out learning system. This also bridges the gap between special school and regular school systems. With this in view, the Institute started services to train children with borderline intelligence and mild Intellectual Disability to appear for the Open Basic Education programme under NIOS. NIEPID provides special coaching classes for primary level students with learning problems and Intellectual Disability. During 2023-24, total 33 students enrolled and among them 23 children appeared & passed level (A, B, C) final examination.



## Chapter 7

### Department of Medical Sciences

The Department of Medical Sciences (DMS) provides services for client's assessment and evaluation ranging from physical, medical examinations and essential biochemical screening and examinations. After a comprehensive assessment, a management plan and intervention packages are developed. Clients are referred to other medical services wherever needed. In addition to the services, the department also conducts a one-year long term course; namely, Post Graduate Diploma in Early Intervention (PGDEI) approved by RCI and affiliated to Osmania University. The department also undertakes various short-term programmes for professionals in medical and early intervention services for persons with Intellectual Disabilities and conducts Group Parent Training Programmes. The department also takes up research projects related to medical and aspects of intellectual disability.

#### Services provided to clients

Department of Medical Sciences provides the following services.

##### Medical Services (Psychiatry & Paediatrics)

- Medical Assessment, Investigations, diagnosis and treatment.
- Analysis and reporting of electro-encephalogram
- Evaluation of the new clients as well as follow-up clients registered with NIEPID
- Offering medical treatment to the required clients registered at NIEPID

##### Biochemical analysis

- Carrying out biochemical investigations of the samples (blood and urine etc.)
- Biochemical analysis of the reports

##### Nursing Services

- Anthropometric Measurements of New clients after registration
- Nursing support & First aid
- Counselling & Guidance to parents.

##### Early Intervention Services

- Early Intervention assessment for children below six years of age with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, Cerebral Palsy, Genetic disorders, for Early detection and Intervention.

##### EEG Test

- Preparation of client for EEG testing
- Carrying out EEG test on the client
- Recording the EEG and submitting the report to the medical doctor for the diagnosis



### Neurological Services

- Neurological assessment of children with Intellectual Disabilities having neurological problems.
- Evaluation of EEG reports for diagnosis purpose for giving medication to clients

### Orthopedic Services

- Identifying clients with Quadriplegia in providing intervention for a child with Cerebral Palsy and other orthopedic related problems.

### Homoeopathy Services

- Homoeopathy assessment is done for children with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.

### Dental Services

- Dental assessment is done for children with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities to solve Dental Related problems.

### Pharmacy services

- New Clients & Follow-up clients visiting NIEPID who come under the Below Poverty Line Category are given free medicine from Pharmacy prescribed by Medical Doctors.

### Genetic Counselling

- Genetic counselling services are provided for children with Neuro developmental and Genetic disorders.

### Endocrinology

- Endocrinology services are provided for identifying Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities children with growth, height, weight and Hormonal related problems and treating them.

## Chapter 8

### Department of Therapeutics

The Department of Therapeutics (DOT) consists of Speech-Language Therapy, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy. The department assesses and evaluates speech/language therapeutics needs; physical and occupational therapeutics needs and carries out management/intervention/ rehabilitation in concerned areas. Home Based intervention programs and demonstrations for the same are given to parents of each client. Parent counseling is done by explaining the nature of the client's condition and his/ her level of functioning.

#### 8.1 Services provided to clients:

Department of Therapeutics provides the following services.

##### 1. Speech Therapy

- Speech, Language, Hearing assessment & evaluation of the new clients and follow-up clients registered with NIEPID.
- Diagnosing the problem of the clients and offering Speech, Language, Hearing treatment.
- Undertaking research projects pertaining to Speech, Language & Audiology

##### 2. Physiotherapy

- Physiotherapy assessment & evaluation of the new clients as well as follow-up clients registered with NIEPID.
- Diagnosing the problem of the clients and offering Physiotherapy intervention.
- Offering therapeutic intervention for Physiotherapy problems of the clients.
- Undertaking research projects pertaining to Physiotherapy.

##### 3. Occupational Therapy

- This service mainly addresses issues such as developing performance components, improving specific sensory, motor, cognitive-perceptual skills and promoting independent living.
- Clients requiring services are taken up for a detailed evaluation, and a specific intervention programme is developed according to the individual needs. Those in need of assistive and adaptive devices are guided to appropriate centres.

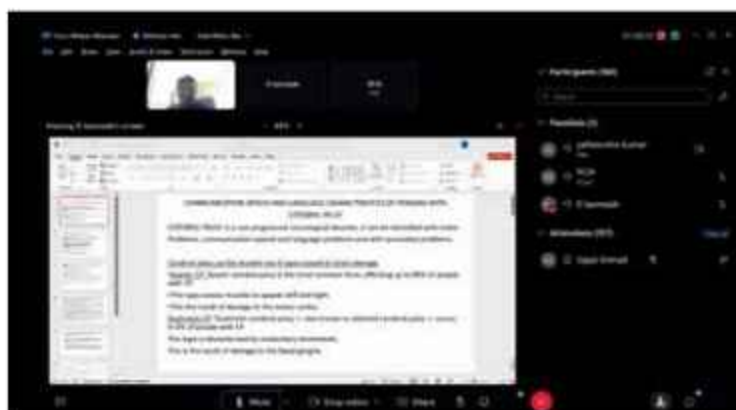

## 8.2 Human Resource Development (HRD)

- All the long term courses namely M.Phil Rehabilitation, M.Ed (ID), B.Ed Spl (ID), PGDEI, D.Ed Spl. (ID), DECSE (ID), DVR (ID) and CBID have chapter/ units on speech language therapy, physiotherapy and occupational therapy. Inputs in theory & practical classes were provided to students of long term courses throughout the year by Faculty & Technical staff of the department.
- During the year 2023-24, 08 STPs were conducted benefiting 487 professionals, and 08 Webinars were conducted benefiting 800 professionals. In addition to the short-term programmes, 06 Parent Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 370 parents of children with Intellectual Disability. The STPs details are presented in **Table. 8b**

## Chapter 9

### Department of Adult Independent Living (DAIL)

NIEPID has an exclusive department called the Department of Adult Independent Living (DAIL), formerly known as the Department of Vocational Training, to develop vocational training models suitable to Indian conditions. The department started its activities in the year 1991. In the initial stage, the department's focus was to explore the job market for vocational training of Adults with Intellectual Disabilities.

Presently, DAIL functions to organize vocational rehabilitation and skill development programs for persons with Intellectual Disabilities so that the individuals with Intellectual Disabilities can excel in their lives.

The main objectives of the department are:

- Develop human resources to extend comprehensive services for adults with Intellectual Disabilities.
- Provide vocational training and placement support under different employment models.
- Engage in R&D activities to enhance the quality of life of adults with Intellectual Disabilities.
- Extend support in the transition periods such as vocationalization to employment and employment to Independent living.
- Various stages in the evolution of the DAIL –experimentation, execution, enabling and empowerment.





### 9.1 Vocational Rehabilitation Services: Phase wise training programme

DAIL is implementing the three-phase training model comprising of 1. Generic skill training 2. Specific skill training and 3. Independent skill functioning. Generic skill focuses on work readiness skills, and it is the primary stage for preparing the adults with intellectual disabilities for the specific skill training stage. Specific skill training involves training in the selected jobs under supervision, and independent skill functioning focuses on training extended to undertake the job without supervision.

### 9.2 Skill Training Programme

Department is also undertaking a skill training programme, as per National Action Plan (NAP), SIPDA scheme guidelines, in which training is extended in one specific job for a minimum of one year and a maximum of two years. These trades are aligned from Skill Council for Persons with Disabilities (ScPwD) for short duration training. On successful completion of the training, the department extends support for the placement of adult trainees with intellectual disabilities in the open, supported, group or self-employment.

### 9.3 Human Resource Development:

The department conducts a one-year Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (Intellectual Disability). This course is designed to create human resources suitable for providing vocational rehabilitation services for persons with intellectual disabilities. Department also extends support to long term programmes of the institute as and when assigned.

DAIL conducts various short-term training programmes for professionals working in the field disability rehabilitation on skill development and vocational training aspects. During the year 2023-24, 1 STP was conducted benefiting 23 professionals, and 4 Webinars were conducted benefiting 3,684 professionals. In addition to the short-term programmes, 25 Parent Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 867 parents of children with Intellectual Disability. The STPs details are presented in **Table 9a**.

#### 9.4 Networking and consultancy services to voluntary organizations

Department is also undertaking networking and consultancy services in the field of vocational rehabilitation to NGOs or Voluntary organizations

#### 9.5 Research & Development:

DAIL is undertaking research and development activities in the field of vocational rehabilitation of persons with Intellectual Disabilities. The department has developed Comprehensive Assessment Tool for Vocational Training of Persons with Adult Intellectual Disabilities and the same is widely being used in all Vocational Training Centers.

#### 9.6 Special Employees National Meet:

DAIL has been organizing Special Employees National Meet since 1995. Special Employees National Meet is a unique programme in which Persons with Intellectual Disability who are on remunerative jobs are offered an opportunity to assemble at one platform to showcase their vocational skills, communication abilities, socialization, marketing skills etc. This national level meet has been drawing attention of the targets as there is overwhelming response during the last 29 years.



## Chapter 10

### Department of Library and Information Services

The NIEPID Library has 16,048 resources (purchased, gratis/ gifted, non-book material, bound volume and reprints) as of 31-03-2024. The Library subscribed more than 44 International Journals related to Intellectual Disabilities and various fields. During the year, more than 16,013 professionals, students and staff have utilized the NIEPID library services.

#### 10.1 Posters and Flip charts

The Institute continues to undertake public awareness programmes such as printing posters, publishing information materials and flip charts for the grassroot level workers to identify disabilities.

#### 10.2 Website Digitalization

The complete website has been modified to a new look with flash images, and it has been made disabled-friendly. The Institute has developed the website in Hindi as well. The Security audit for the website has been carried out, and the process of seeking Standardization, Testing and Quality Certification (STQC) is in progress. The Institute cleared the anomalies which STQC generates. NIEPID is waiting for STQC Certification. The website of the Institute ([www.niepid.nic.in](http://www.niepid.nic.in)) is hosted at NIC Hyderabad.

#### 10.3 Publications

NIEPID, from its inception itself, upheld the practice of publishing its findings from clinical studies and R&D activities in the form of printed books, video films and CDs. Basically, the publications are brought out in English language. However, these publications have been translated in to few other Indian Regional languages. In addition to this, information collected from authentic sources has been printed as pamphlets and leaflets.

#### 10.4 Distribution of Publications

Every year NIEPID gets requests from various sources for the books and other materials which the Institute publishes. These materials are distributed by levying a nominal charge on printing and handling. The distribution of NIEPID publications during the year 2023-24 is given in **Table 10a**.

## Chapter 11

### Regional Centre Noida & New Delhi

NIEPID Regional Centre, New Delhi, was established in February 1986 at Kasturba Niketan, Lajpat Nagar -II, New Delhi, to provide the best educational climate where each professional can develop their maximum potential in the field of Intellectual Disability. The centre had set up “ANKUR”, an Early Intervention Centre, in 1990 to provide services to children below 5 years of age. Later, RC, New Delhi shifted its activities to its permanent building at Noida in February 2015.

The centre conducts three long-term programmes and various short-term programmes for professionals working in the field of Intellectual Disability. The Centre also conducts various parent training programs for parents every year. In addition to this, RC Noida provides Early Intervention services to children below 6 years of age; the Centre also provides services to clients having delayed development, Intellectual Disability and other associated conditions. The centre conducts awareness camps and screening camps as part of its extension and outreach activity and provides support to PwIDs to access schemes and other concessions of the Govt. of India. It also provides technical support to local NGOs, schools and other related institutions working in the field of Intellectual Disability.

## Chapter 12

### Regional Centre Kolkata

NIEPID Regional Centre Kolkata was established on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1986 in NILD campus Bonhooghly, B.T. Road Kolkata. Later in 1999, it shifted to its own building and after that started spreading its services in the eastern part of the country. NIEPID RC Kolkata is successfully running the following services in tune with the objectives of NIEPID.

#### 12.1 Human Resource Development.

**Long Term Courses:** NIEPID RC, Kolkata, conducted five long term training programmes in the year 2023-24 recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India, and Graduate-level courses are affiliated to the Bengal State University, which includes:

- M.Ed. in Special Education (ID) - 2 years; Intake/Enrolment: 13/00
- B.Ed in Special Education (ID) - 2 year; Intake/Enrolment: 33/26
- Diploma in Special Education (IDD) - 2 years; Intake/Enrolment: 35/28  
Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (ID) - 1 year; Intake/Enrolment: 25/17
- B.Ed Special Education (ID)-ODL-2 year-Distance Mode; Intake/Enrolment: 50/49

**Short Term Training Programmes:** RC Kolkata conducts Continuous Rehabilitation Education (CRE) for rehabilitation professionals and Personnel to update them with the latest development in Intellectual Disability. It also conducts workshops and training programs for parents and siblings. During the year, 22 STPs were conducted benefiting 1,752 professionals and 12 Webinars were conducted benefiting 806 professionals. In addition to the short - term programmes, 26 Parent Training Programmes were conducted, benefiting 836 parents of children with Intellectual Disability.

#### 12.2 General Services

NIEPID RC Kolkata provides multi-disciplinary services to persons with Intellectual disabilities such as psychological Services, medical services, educational Services, vocational training, early intervention, physiotherapy, occupational therapy and sensory integration therapy. The service activity details are provided in **Table 12a**.

### **12.3 Extension and Outreach Services**

NIEPID RC, Kolkata organizes various extension and outreach programmes like IQ assessment camps, awareness programmes for regular school teachers and parents having children with intellectual disabilities. It also conducts orientation and awareness programmes in various districts of West Bengal. The centre extends support services for northeast programmes and participates in melas and exhibitions. The centre also participates in Regional Parents' Meets and Special Employees National Meet.

### **12.4 Consultancy services to the voluntary organization:**

The centre faculties provide referral services, job placement for a person with intellectual disability, conduct campus interviews for trainees of long-term courses, and guidance for established NGOs or Parents organizations.

### **12.5 Vocational training for Adult Independent Living:**

To rehabilitate the persons with intellectual disabilities economically and socially, adults with intellectual disabilities are given training in different trades like screen printing, spiral binding, glass painting, fabric, file making, envelope making, paper bag making, jewelry, embroidery and on the job, training is arranged after successful completion of training in particular trades.

### **12.6 Special Education cum Activity Centre:**

The Centre has 101 enrolled students in the age range of 3 years to below 18 years in two shifts- morning and afternoon. Six classrooms range from pre-primary to prevocational. The centre also focuses on co-curricular activities like dance, music, sports, and functional academics. Parents meetings are conducted monthly and report cards are given quarterly to showcase the progress achieved by the students.

### **12.7 Internship and Educational Visits:**

Different organizations are approaching the regional centre for educational visit and block placement for observation at NIEPID RC Kolkata at regular intervals every year, such as nursing colleges, local NGOs, universities, and Colleges.

### **12.8 Documentation and Dissemination:**

The Centre has introduced digitalization of all the services rendered to Persons with Intellectual Disability. The institution has a well-equipped library with a good collection of books and journals in intellectual disability and allied fields.



### 12.9 Other Activities:

NIEPID RC, Kolkata, observes Independence Day, Republic Day, International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD), Down syndrome day and Autism Day. The centre also celebrates the Annual Day of NIEPID. Students with special needs participate in the National and International Championship of Special Olympic Games.

## Chapter 13

### Regional Centre Navi Mumbai

NIEPID Regional Centre Navi Mumbai was established in the year 1987. This centre has started to cater to the needs of the Western Region of the country such as- covering the states of Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Goa, Lakshadweep and Daman & Diu. The new building of the institute was inaugurated on 24<sup>th</sup> December 2021 at Plot 44A, Sector 5, Kharghar, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra. The newly constructed building is a state-of-art building with complete accessibility features through which the centre is now extending its services to Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (Divyangjan). The services offered by the centre include Psychological assessment, Behaviour Management, Parent Counseling, Early Intervention, Special Education Assessment and Intervention, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Vocational Assessment, Skill Training, Family cottage, etc.

The Centre conducts long-term including Masters, Bachelor and Diploma level programs in special education. It also conducts short-term training programmes for rehabilitation professionals as well as training programs for parents, aganwadi workers, college students etc. Also, awareness programmes and camps for Persons with intellectual disabilities are conducted by the Centre.

#### 13.1 Human Resource Development

#### 13.2 Parent/Sibling Training Programmes

A total of 32 PTP / Sibling Training Programmes were held, benefiting 764 Parents / Siblings of PwID.



### 13.3 Research and Development

A project entitled 'Development of Videos on Activities of Daily Living' is completed in collaboration with PRATHAM and CBM. A total of 36 films were developed under the project. The videos were released by Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), MSJ&E, Government of India during his visit at NIEPID Regional Centre, Navi Mumbai on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023.



### Skill Development program:

Skill development program for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (Divyangjan) under SIPDA Scheme of Government of India was started on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024 in 2 job role i.e. Food & Beverage Associate and Hospitality Associate with student strength of 20 students per batch (total 40 students). The programs are aimed to provide meaningful employment to Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (Divyangjan) and facilitate their adult independent living.

## Chapter 14

### Model Special Education Centre, Noida & New Delhi

NIEPID Model Special Education Centre (MSEC) was established in 1964 by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. It was brought under the administrative control of NIEPID, Secunderabad, in 1986. The school believes that quality of life of every person with intellectual disability is equal to that of other citizens in the country and strives to provide support to students with Intellectual Disability to so that they live independently to the maximum extent possible.

NIEPID-MSEC had partly shifted to its Noida Campus on 17 February 2015. New Delhi Centre provides day care special education, while Noida centre has both daycare and residential facilities. The number of children on the roll is 85.

## Chapter 15

### Extension and Outreach services

#### 15.1 Programmes in the North-East Region

NIEPID has initiated programmes for creating awareness about Intellectual Disability and facilitating support to strengthen quality services through State Government and NGOs in the North-East Region since 2002. As a part of the Northeast activities for the year 2023-24, NIEPID conducted awareness camps, Sensitization and training programmes for parents, professionals, personnel and identification and assessment camps for persons with intellectual disability and other disabilities in four states of North-East Region. During the year, 68 programmes were conducted in the NE region benefiting 20,934 persons (**Table 39**). An amount of 136.68 lakhs was spent during the year towards Northeast Programmes. The participants were paid TA/DA for attending the programmes. The details of programmes conducted by NIEPID in the Northeast Region (state-wise) are given in **Appendix G (page 173)**.

#### 15.1.1 Establishment of CAI Lab and Model Class rooms

To increase the benefit of using technology for children with Intellectual Disability, NIEPID has established Computer Assisted Instructions (CAI) Lab in special schools in the North Eastern States, including Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Sikkim, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Mizoram and Tripura.



### 15.1.2. North East Programme at Meghalaya:

NIEPID Secunderabad has conducted a four – day TLM kits distribution, Parent & Teacher Training Program, Students awareness and Kiran MHRH Awareness programmes to the PwDs / Professionals / Parents and caregivers on 19<sup>th</sup> -22<sup>nd</sup> November 2023 at Meghalaya.



### 15.1.3 Sensitisation cum Awareness Program at Assam:

NIEPID Secunderabad in collaboration with Government of Assam organised Sensitisation cum Awareness Program on 'Importance of Early Intervention Services' for ASHA Workers and Anganwadi Workers of Sonitpur at Darrang College, Sonitpur on 04<sup>th</sup> October 2023. A total of around 140 ASHA and Anganwadi Workers attended the program. Teachers Training program on Rehabilitation Services and RPWD Act 2016 and Behavioural Issues in Children with Developmental Disabilities at Sonitpur IMA house, Sonitpur on 05<sup>th</sup> October 2023. A total of 50 Teachers attended during the program. Awareness and Sensitisation Program was conducted at Nipam M V School, Tejpur on 06<sup>th</sup> October 2023. Around 40 students benefitted by the programme



## 15.2 Community Based Programmes

During 2023-24, 30,464 people benefited through 360 Community Based programmes (other than northeast). The programmes include awareness rallies, assessment camps, NPM/RPMs, orientation to visiting teams to create awareness on disability etc. The Programmes/Activities conducted by NIEPID during 2023-24 under CBP including camps, PTPs, orientation programmes to visiting teams etc., are presented in **Table 15.b**. ### 15.2.1 Orientation Programmes for Visiting Teams

Many professionals, eminent persons, students pursuing long term courses, medical, Nursing, and Government officials and caretakers visit NIEPID and its Regional Centres every year. NIEPID and its Regional Centres provide orientation on disability and Intellectual Disability to these visiting professionals/ Teams coming from different disciplines.

### 15.3 Consultancy and Technical Support

#### 15.3.1 Technical Appraisal of NGO Applications for Grants-in-aid from MSJ&E Government of India

Under this scheme, to promote voluntary services for persons with disabilities, the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), MSJ&E, Govt. of India gives grants-in-aid to the non- governmental organizations in the country. At the request of the Ministry, the Institute undertakes technical evaluation of programmes implemented by various NGOs and submits reports to the Ministry.

#### 15.3.2 Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI)

During the year, the staff of the Institute participated in the meetings of the Rehabilitation Council of India in developing and evaluating curricula for various courses. Faculty members also conduct inspections on behalf of RCI of various teacher training institutes in the country.

#### 15.3.3 Technical support to NGOs

NIEPID has been extending technical support to NGOs and other institutes since its inception under this objective.

#### 15.3.4 SC / ST Scheme for TLM Kits Distribution:

A total of 2,171 TLM Kits were distributed to PwIDs. Centre & Camp based programmes were conducted benefiting 1,611 SC PwIDs & 560 ST PwIDs.



## Chapter 16

### Assistance to Persons with Disabilities for Purchase/ Fitting of Aids/ Appliances (ADIP) Scheme

The primary objective of this programme is to organize composite rehabilitation camps for the distribution of Aids and Appliances to persons with disabilities in the country. The procedure involves conducting the assessment followed by distributing the aids and appliances to the persons with disabilities identified during the assessment camp. The support of the Office of the District Magistrate/Collector is always ensured in conducting the camps. The procedure involves the following steps:

#### 16.1 Publicity

Before conducting the camps, wide publicity is given through printed handouts and are distributed in the regional language.

#### 16.2 Professionals involved

Generally, the camp professionals are Clinical/rehabilitation psychologists, psychiatrists, Special Educators (ID), and other therapeutic staff such as physiotherapists, occupational therapists, and Speech therapists.

#### 16.3 Data maintenance

Following data are maintained concerning ADIP activities:

- Case registration form of each client covered in the camp
- Assessment forms
- Preparing the details of aids and appliances, category-wise
- Details of the distribution of aids and appliances
- Computerized documentation of the 21-column register

#### 16.4 Financial Support

NIEPID Secunderabad extends financial support, to create awareness regarding ADIP camp, the conduct of identification and assessment camp, procurement of aids and appliances and their distribution. During assessment and distribution camps, the beneficiaries and escorts are provided refreshments.



### 16.5 Networking

Networking with local NGOs and establishing linkages with medical colleges/district hospitals / rural hospitals /PHCs/ DDRCs / any other professionally competent agency for the care of the beneficiaries and aids/appliances is ensured.

### 16.6 Follow up

Follow up services are organized in coordination with the existing NGOs to help the beneficiaries assisted under the scheme about using aids and appliances supplied to them and other related services required for the Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities.

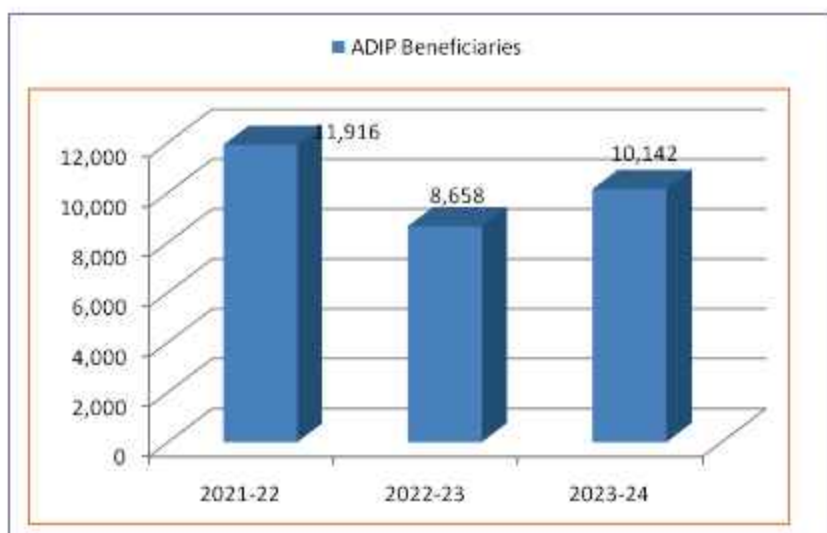
### 16.7 TLM KIT Distributions

A total of **10,142** TLM Kits were distributed to persons with disabilities during the year 2023-24 under the ADIP scheme. In total, 65 camps were conducted to distribute TLM kits under ADIP Scheme during the year 2023-24, benefiting **6,557** PwIDs. NIEPID HQs, RCs and CRCs centre based programmes were conducted benefiting **3,585** PwIDs. The details of the distribution camps of aids and appliances are given in **Table 16a**. An amount of Rs.950.73 Lakhs was spent during the year under this scheme.

### 17.1 International Yoga Day:

India achieved a remarkable milestone on June 21, 2023 as 20,000 Divyangjan (persons with disabilities) across the country, including 2,500 persons with ID at Kanha Wellness Centre in Hyderabad's Rangareddy District, participated in a historic mass yoga event envisioned by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The participants included individuals with various disabilities such as visual and hearing impairments, locomotor disabilities, intellectual and developmental disabilities, autism, cerebral palsy, and thalassemia. Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment, was Chief Guest for this Mega event. He participated alongside the Divyangjan, performing yoga for 45 minutes. He noted the overwhelming enthusiasm as participants from 16 states, from Delhi to Kerala and Gujarat to West Bengal, gathered under one roof to perform yogasanas. Hon'ble Minister of State Shri A. Narayana Swamy who participated as guest of honour emphasized Yoga's role in promoting harmony and inclusivity, advocating for the recognition of Divyangjan abilities and supporting the concept of Vasudhaiva Kutumbkam (the world is one family). The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, MSJE, in coordination with NIEPID, Secunderabad, organized the event, during which 200 beneficiaries received free TLM kits and aids under the ADIP scheme. The historic gathering earned three prestigious records; viz., International World Book of Records, Asia Book of Records, and India Book of Records.





### 17.2 NIEPID Indian test of Intelligence (NITI) for IQ Assessment:

The Institute achieved a remarkable milestone in its History by developing NIEPID Indian Test of Intelligence for IQ assessment. The IQ assessment tool, which is first of its kind in India, was released by Dr. Virendra Kumar, Hon'ble Cabinet Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India on December 11, 2023. The assessment tool received approval from the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) after clinical trials and validation. This comprehensive intelligence assessment tool, designed for children aged 3-18 years, is based on the five-factor model of Cattell-Horn-Carroll Gf-Gc theory, encompassing Knowledge, Fluid Reasoning, Quantitative Reasoning, Visual Spatial Reasoning, and Working Memory. The test's development involved the largest sample size to date (4,070 participants) collected across six zones according to NSSO, spanning 11 states from Jammu & Kashmir to Kerala and Gujarat to Assam. The diverse sample included children from Anganwadi centers, Kendriya Vidyalayas, state government schools, private schools, and orphanages, with additional clinical trials conducted at NIEPID in Secunderabad, Noida, and Navi Mumbai. The test features language-independent items (except for vocabulary and comprehension dimensions) and flexible administration to accommodate behavioral limitations. This standardized tool, with its robust reliability and validity, will play a crucial role in issuing disability certificates for persons with intellectual disabilities, enabling them to access government benefits and concessions, thereby contributing to improved quality of life and support.



### 17.3 Divya Kala Shakthi:

The Institute organized Divya Kala Shakti – an event to showcase the talents of persons with disabilities on February 10, 2024. The twin cities of Hyderabad-Secunderabad witnessed this remarkable cultural extravaganza organized by NIEPID in collaboration with DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment showcasing the talents of persons with disabilities. The event featured 105 participants from five southern states of Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu. Performers with various disabilities, including hearing and visual impairments, intellectual disabilities, autism, thalassemia, muscular dystrophy, Down's syndrome, and locomotor disabilities, presented group and solo dances, music, and art exhibitions. Dr. Tamilisai Sounderarajan, Governor of Telangana and Lt. Governor of



Puducherry, was the Chief Guest on the occasion who emphasized that persons with disabilities need appreciation, not sympathy. She commended NIEPID's efforts, particularly highlighting their development of India's first indigenous Test of Intelligence. The Governor stressed the importance of fostering economic independence and inclusion, while NIEPID Director Major B.V. Ram Kumar, faculty, staff and students of long term courses of NIEPID enthusiastically participated and encouraged the performers of the programme.



#### 17.4 XXIX National Parents Meet:

NIEPID, Secunderabad hosted the 29th National Parents Meet in collaboration with PARIVAAR NCPO from March 2-3, 2024. The event attracted 360 parents and children with special needs from across India. Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, MSJ&E, GoI, participated virtually as Chief Guest, highlighting various DEPwD initiatives for empowering families of children with Intellectual and Developmental disabilities. NIEPID Director Major B V Ram Kumar addressed the gathering about the institute's efforts towards social inclusion and accessible mindset. Former National Trust chairperson Ms. Poonam Natrajan and PARIVAAR president Shri Pankaj Maru also shared their insights. The meet featured technical sessions led by eminent resource persons, focusing on successful livelihood models for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (PwIDs), community support systems, financial planning, and government schemes. Panel discussions were also conducted to address various aspects of support for PwIDs.



### 17.5 Regional Parents' Meets 2023-24:

In addition to the National Parents' Meet, NIEPID also organizes Regional Parents' Meet (RPM) with the objective to provide focused attention on the concerns of parents at regional levels. These regional parents' meets are organized in liaison with the National Federation of Parents Associations and in collaboration with one of the registered parents' association from the selected region. It is also expected that these regional parents' meets facilitate the expansion of the network of parent's association to form more self-help groups and address the regional issues related to persons with intellectual disability and their parents. In the year 2023-24, 3 RPMs were held benefiting 479 parents. The details are presented in (Table 17a).

### 17.6 XXIX Special Employees National Meet:

The 29<sup>th</sup> Special Employees National Meet was held on 08<sup>th</sup> & 09<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at NIEPID, Secunderabad. Shri N.V.S.Reddy, IAS, CMD, Metro Rail was invited as Chief Guest and Shri M.S.Subrahmanyam, IAAS, Director General, AGs Office, Guest of honour and Sri Prabhakar Rao, Convener, All India Forum for Small and Medium Industries as Special Guest for the programme. Cdr Bijur, GC member, NIEPID and Sri Kolli Nageshwar Rao, President, All India Disabled Rights Forum also graced the programme with their presence. Shri B.V. Ram Kumar, Director, NIEPID visited the stalls exhibited by the special employees and organizations. Representatives of NGOs from 15 states have participated in the event. A total of 149 special employees participated in the programme.



### 17.7 National Conference on “Transformative Solutions and Innovations in Disability Rehabilitation(NCTSIDR)-2023”:

National Conference on “Transformative Solutions and Innovations in Disability Rehabilitation (NCTSIDR)-2023” was held on 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2023 at NIEPID, Secunderabad. NCTSIDR- 2023 was inaugurated by Shri B V Ram Kumar, Director, NIEPID, Dr. Smita Awasthi, Founder Director, BMI, Dr. Smita Deshpande, RML Hospitals, Dr S.D. Sudarshan, Ex-Director, CDAC, Bangalore, Dr. Lokesh Lingappa, Rainbow Hospitals, Smt. V R P Sheileja Rao, former faculty of NIEPID, Secunderabad. Dr. Amrita Sahay, & Dr. Shilpa Manogna, Faculty, NIEPID coordinated the National Conference. A total of 204 professionals/ students/ parents /PwDs and other stake holders participated in this conference. A total of 48 technical papers and posters were presented by professionals /academicians /young researchers / Student trainees from different parts of the country.



### 17.8 National Conference on Techno-Pedagogic Approach in Rehabilitation of Children with Special Needs, “Rehabilitation 2.0”:

NIEPID, Secunderabad hosted the National Conference "Rehabilitation 2.0" on Techno-Pedagogic Approach in Rehabilitation of Children with Special Needs on November 24-25, 2023. The conference was inaugurated by Chief Guest Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, Ministry of SJ&E, alongside distinguished guests Prof. Rajesh Kumar (Dean of Education, Osmania University), Prof. Hrushikesh Senapathy (Former Director, NCERT), and



Dr. K. Thiyagu (Central University of Kerala), NIEPID Director B. V. Ram Kumar welcomed the dignitaries, while Secretary Shri Aggarwal emphasized the importance of training parents and siblings of children with special needs. The event attracted 312 rehabilitation professionals and stakeholders from 10 states, including Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, West Bengal, and Kerala. A total of 46 papers were submitted, of which 29 papers were selected for presentation and 12 for poster presentation, encouraging young researchers and students.



### 17.9 Two Days International Workshop on Indian Scale for Assessment of Autism:

NIEPID organized a Two Day International Workshop on Indian Scale for Assessment of Autism (ISAA) at DAIC, New Delhi on December 11-12, 2023. The event was inaugurated by Chief Guest Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, alongside Joint Secretary Shri Rajeev Sharma and Director of National Institutes Shri Vineet Singhal. NIEPID Director Major B. V. Ram Kumar welcomed the dignitaries. Dr. Saroj Arya presented the ISAA tool's development process. Secretary Shri Aggarwal highlighted India's emergence as a scientific innovation hub, noting that NIEPID's tools are used internationally. The workshop attracted 100 participants, including 18 from 11 countries such as USA, UK, Canada, Germany, New Zealand, Kuwait, UAE, Bangladesh, Bhutan, and Nepal. Secretary DEPwD emphasized the significance of the 2016 ISAA scale and NIEPID's new Indian Test of Intelligence, mentioning that these tools are being made available as open source, with international training workshops being conducted for professionals.





### 17.10 Three Days International Workshop on NIEPID Indian Test of Intelligence:

A three-day International CRE workshop on NIEPID Indian Test of Intelligence was conducted at NIEPID RC, NOIDA from January 29-31, 2024. Director, NIEPID, Shri B.V Ram Kumar addressed the participants, outlining NIEPID's objectives and work. The workshop attracted 81 RCI-registered psychologists and rehabilitation professionals from prestigious institutions including AIIMS Delhi, IIT Roorkee, AIISH Mysore, NIMHR Sehore, CRC Kozhikode, CRC Guwahati, and KGMC Lucknow. Participants from 15 states, representing various private organizations and NGOs from cities like Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, Ludhiana, Nagpur, Chandigarh, Karnal, Dehradun, Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Mumbai, Faridabad, Gurgaon, Noida, and Delhi, received hands-on training in test administration, scoring, interpretation, and report writing. The programme, coordinated by Dr. Sunita Devi, concluded with certificate distribution and participant feedback collection about their workshop experience and learning.



### 17.11 World Autism Awareness Day:

NIEPID observed World Autism Day and Autism Awareness Week (April 2-6, 2023) across its headquarters, Regional Centres, and Composite Regional Centres by organizing diverse activities including flash mobs, awareness rallies, quiz, and TLM Kits distribution. The celebrations featured poster competitions, signature campaigns, street plays, cultural performances, and sports activities such as Bocci games and wrestling. Special activities included dot painting, gardening, and fusion dance. A national webinar on "Autism Spectrum Disorders" was conducted on April 5, 2023, at NIEPID Secunderabad, with 989 participants including parents, teachers, rehabilitation professionals, and stakeholders.





### 17.12 Dr. B R Ambedkar Birthday celebrations:

The 132<sup>nd</sup> birthday of Bharat Ratna Dr. B R Ambedkar was observed on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023 at Auditorium, NIEPID, Secunderabad. Major B V Ram Kumar, Director, NIEPID and all HOD of various departments along with all staff, faculty and students were present in the programme. On this occasion, Director has guided the staff and students that discrimination at all levels should be removed from society in his speech to gathering.



### 17.13 Global Accessibility Awareness Day:

NIEPID and DEPwD organized a National Level Webinar on Global Accessibility Awareness Day (GAAD) on May 18, 2023. Secretary Shri Rajesh Aggarwal, IAS, virtually inaugurated the event, discussing accessibility provisions for PwDs. The webinar, conducted in English (10 AM-12 PM) and Hindi (3 PM-5 PM), attracted 2,367 registrations, with 238 participants joining via Google link and 2,019 through YouTube. During the event, TLM kits were distributed to 160 Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (PwIDs) who attended physically at NIEPID premises.



#### 17.14 National Level CRE Organised by OPAI in collaboration with NIEPID:

National CRE on "Current Status of Prosthetic and Orthotics Professionals in India" was organised by Orthotics & Prosthetics Association of India in collaboration with NIEPID on 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> May 2023 at NIEPID Secunderabad. Shri B V Ram Kumar, Director, NIEPID graced the occasion as Chief Guest along with Shri Ajay Chaudhary, GM, ALIMCO, Dr Ravinder Singh, ICMR and other officials were also present on the occasion.



#### 17.15 Study visit of Standing Committee on Social Justice & Empowerment:

The Standing Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment, chaired by Lok Sabha MP Smt. Rama Devi, conducted a study visit to NIEPID, Secunderabad on July 11, 2023. The 12-member parliamentary committee, accompanied by four government officials, was welcomed by DEPwD Director Shri Vineet Singhal and NIEPID Director Shri B.V. Ram Kumar. The committee toured various facilities including CDEIC, Special Education Centre, DAIL, and General Services, interacting with parents and divyang beneficiaries. Director Shri Ram Kumar presented NIEPID's key achievements over the past three years, including CSR initiatives and the development of the Indian Test of Intelligence. Over 100 persons with intellectual disabilities received TLM kits during the visit. The committee commended NIEPID's services and staff while recommending three key initiatives: increasing rural awareness programs for causes and prevention, expanding prenatal care and genetic counseling awareness, and enhancing HRD programs to train more professionals.



### 17.16 Swachhata Pakhwada:

A special cleaning campaign took place under Swachhata Pakhawada activities at NIEPID Secunderabad from 16<sup>th</sup> July to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023. Shri B V Ram Kumar, Director (Offg) along with other staff members actively participated. In partnership with NIEPID, Govt of India, The Hans Foundation aims to make a positive impact on their lives at their doorsteps.

Mobile therapeutic experts provide doorstep care, including early identification, medical assistance, therapies, education, and counselling. Our mission is to ensure that every person with a disability receives the necessary support for a fulfilling and productive life.



### 17.18 77<sup>th</sup> Independence Day:

The 77th Independence Day Celebrations on 15.08.2023, Major B V Ram Kumar, Director (Offg), NIEPID hoisted flag with National Anthem at NIEPID, Secunderabad. NIEPID HQs, RCs and CRCs performed various Cultural activities.



### 17.19 World Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Day:

NIEPID, Secunderabad marked World Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Day 2023 on September 7th by conducting a national-level webinar on Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and organizing extensive public awareness campaigns. Teams of staff and students visited various public locations including bus stations, railway stations, and markets, where they distributed informational pamphlets, displayed banners and posters at crossroads, and engaged directly with the public to raise awareness about muscular dystrophy.

### 17.20 World Physiotherapy Day:

On the occasion of “World Physiotherapy Day 2023”, National level webinar on “Influence of Aquatic Therapy on children with Locomotor Challenges” was conducted on 8th September 2023 by NIEPID, Secunderabad. Around 130 participants with different educational background in disability rehabilitation attended the resourceful webinar and benefitted by the insights.



### **17.21 World Suicide Prevention Week:**

NIEPID Secunderabad Observed World Suicide Prevention Week from 10<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> September 2023. During this week, series of activities were conducted such as Street play and Short orientation, Short film screening and discussion, Suicide prevention awareness programme on 14.09.2023 at Malla Reddy Narayana Women's Medical College and Hospital. A total of 120 post graduate students and Medical doctors attended the awareness programme. Slogan writing competition, Poster competition and Elocution competition Students/ Trainees and faculty participated fervently in all the activities. The week was concluded on 15.09.2023 with prizes distribution for different competition.

### **17.22 Swachhata Hi Seva:**

NIEPID celebrated Swachhata Hi Seva from September 15 to October 2, 2023, with various activities. Parents of children with disabilities took a pledge for a garbage-free nation on September 21 at NIEPID Secunderabad. The institute conducted a cleanliness drive at its facilities on September 22, followed by an eco-friendly rangoli competition for parents and safai karmacharis, drawing 25 participants. On September 27, Dr. Sunita Devi, faculty of Rehabilitation Psychology, delivered an awareness talk at Pallavi Model School, Secunderabad, where 500 students pledged to maintain cleanliness at home and in their locality.

The first agreement, valued at Rs. 5.97 crores, will establish a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy pool at NIEPID Secunderabad to serve persons with intellectual disabilities, cerebral palsy, and other developmental disabilities. The second MoU, worth Rs. 4.3 crores, will expand mobile community rehabilitation services from NIEPID Noida to Kolkata, Mumbai, and Ghaziabad,



aiming to reach 20,000 persons with disabilities annually over three years. Director (Offg) Shri B.V. Ram Kumar and THF CEO Shri Sandeep J. Kapur also agreed to expand services to the North East Region. The MoUs were signed in the presence of Shri Sudeep Sinha, Ms. Shabina, Dr. Shilpa Manogna, Dr. Amrita Sahay, and Mrs. Sabari Gosh.



#### **17.28 World Dwarfism Day:**

On the occasion of World Dwarfism Day, NIEPID Conducted Awareness session to parents, Questionnaire Activity to students and Parents on success story of Dwarf Paralympics. Public awareness program was conducted at Jubilee bus station & Kachiguda railway station and Webinar on "Understanding Dwarfism and its management" on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2023. A total of 122 Rehabilitation professionals & Students attended in this programme

The birthanniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel was observed as "Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day)". National Unity Day was observed on 31st October, 2023, by organizing an awareness rally with the theme "Walk for Unity" at Parade ground, Secunderabad. Shri. B.V. Ram Kumar, Director (Offg), NIEPID, Shri. Dashrath Choudari, Program Coordinator lead the

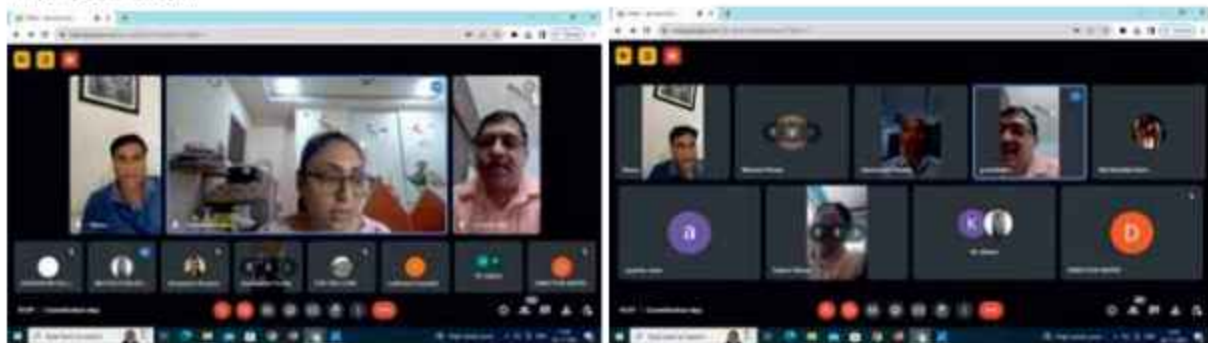

### 17.35 World Braille Day:

World Braille Day was observed on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2024 at NIEPID Secunderabad. The vital role played by Braille as a communication method for individuals with visual impairment. A talk on Braille awareness, A sensitization program by blindfolding persons, online webinar was conducted on the topic fundamentals of Braille and promoting Braille literacy. The programs conducted were aimed at creating awareness in general public professional students / parents.

### 17.36 75th Republic Day Celebrations:

On January 26, 2024, NIEPID Secunderabad celebrated the 75th Republic Day, where Director (Offg) Shri B.V. Ram Kumar hoisted the national flag accompanied by the National Anthem. The celebration featured cultural performances by Special Education Center students, DAIL trainees, long-term course students, and parents.

### 17.37 40<sup>th</sup> Annual Day Celebrations:

NIEPID and its regional centers celebrated their 40th Annual Day on February 22, 2024. The event began with Director Shri B.V. Ram Kumar's welcome address, followed by special children lighting the ceremonial diyas. The celebration brought together persons with intellectual disabilities, their parents, students, faculty, staff, and community members for a day of inclusive activities and cultural performances. Annual sports prizes were awarded to recognize outstanding achievements. The day concluded with the reading of the annual report and a vote of thanks by program coordinators.



### 17.38 International Epilepsy Day:

On International Epilepsy Day, February 12, 2024, NIEPID Secunderabad organized awareness programs featuring addresses by Director Shri B.V. Ram Kumar and talks by Dr. V. Sravan Reddy, Assistant Professor in Psychiatry, and Dr. Prashantr Utage, Pediatric Neurologist. The event, which included an online webinar on epilepsy and its management followed by a Q&A session with doctors, was attended by approximately 200 participants including parents, caregivers, general public, students, and staff.

### 17.39 International Wheelchair Day:

NIEPID HQs, Regional Centers and Composite Regional Centers organized International Wheelchair Day on 01st March, 2024. A training programme on practical demonstration of different types of wheelchairs was conducted in collaboration with Mobility India. Presentations and live demonstrations on use of wheel chair, choosing the ideal wheel chair were covered in the session. Around 100 rehabilitation professionals, parents of persons with disabilities have benefited by attending the programme.

### 17.40 NIEPID jointly collaborated two days National Conference organized by Rainbow Children's Hospital:

A two-day National Conference on "Autism Spectrum Disorders - The Autism Odyssey" was organized by Rainbow Children's Hospital in collaboration with NIEPID and Marham Resonating Resilience on March 16-17, 2024, in Hyderabad. Day one featured workshops on communication, sensory integration, behavior, and careers, concluding with cultural performances. Day two included scientific sessions on evidence-based interventions, alternative treatments, and life-stage approaches to autism, with NIEPID faculty members Sri Dasarath Choudary, Sri G Srinivasulu, and Dr. Sunita Devi serving as resource persons. The conference, attended by over 500 participants, concluded with a valedictory session and CRE certificate distribution.



#### 17.41 International Women's Day:

NIEPID HQs, Regional Centers and Composite Regional Centers celebrated International Women's Day on 08<sup>th</sup> March, 2024. Webinar programme held on Changing the Role of Women In Modern Society. A total of 42 participants attended the programme.

#### 17.42 World Down's syndrome Day

On World Down Syndrome Day, March 21, 2024, NIEPID HQs, Regional Centers, and Composite Regional Centers organized awareness programs where Director Shri. Major B.V. Ram Kumar addressed the importance of early identification and intervention for children with Down Syndrome. CDEIC staff delivered comprehensive talks to parents covering medical, psychological, educational, therapeutic aspects, and government benefits, while raising awareness among the general public, staff, and students.



#### 17.43 Welfare Schemes for SC/ST

During 2023-24, NIEPID implemented various welfare schemes approved by MSJ&E to support persons with intellectual disability from Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST). These initiatives included reimbursing tuition fees, living expenses, and providing books and laptops to SC/ST trainees pursuing long-term professional programs, as per the Central Sector Scholarship Scheme of "Top Class Education for SC/ST Students." Additionally, the institute provided free medicines to BPL category SC/ST clients registered at NIEPID and reimbursed travel allowances (TA/DA) for persons with intellectual disabilities and their escorts who visited the institute for services.

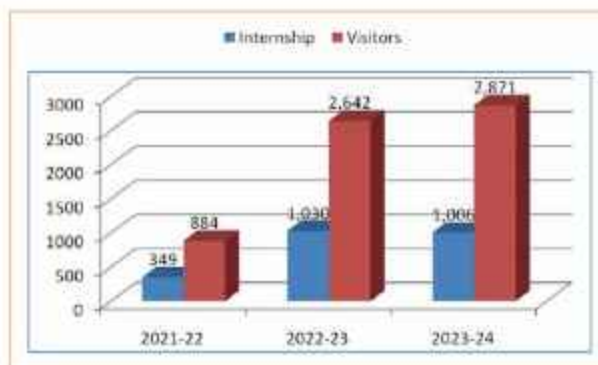


### 17.44 Internship & Visitors

### Other Important Activities / Programmes:

- At NIEPID Secunderabad, an Orientation Programme was organized for 30 Trainee Junior



Civil Judges from Telangana State Judicial Academy on 6th April 2023. The sessions focused on three key areas: Intellectual Disability, Visual Impairment, and Speech and Hearing disabilities.

- NIEPID collaborated with Rainbow hospitals and Telangana Medical council to organize a state-level conference on Autism at Radisson Blue Plaza Hotel, Banjara hills on 16th April 2023. More than 160 participants attended the conference, with 58 qualifying for CRE certificates.
- A Two Days capacity building program was organized by NIEPID for IERPS of Samagra shiksha on 24th & 25th April 2023. During this program, 35 in-service teachers visited CDEIC and observed the best practices.
- NIEPID, in collaboration with NIRDPR, organized a Three Days Workshop on "Policy advocacy through studying interventions to ensure sustainable employment for persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (Stage-1)" from 25th to 27th April 2023. Notable participants included Sri Pankaj Maru from Parivaar(NCPO), Sri Surajit Sikdar from NIRDPR, Sri Karitkeyan Ganesan from Sristi Foundation, Dr Jayaraj from VLCCS Foundation, Smt Anita Bhaskaran and Smt Amrita Roy from Charak Foundation.

  - MSEC Noida students made history at the Special Olympics World summer games 2023 in Berlin, with Ms. Shivani winning three gold medals in Cycling events (500 meter, 1 KM and 2 KM race). Her teammate Mr. Swaraj singh contributed to the success by winning silver and bronze medals in Tennis events.
  - NIEPID RC Navi Mumbai showcased their work at the Divya Kala Mela Indore 2023 from 17th to 23rd June 2023. ### 18.4 Hindi implementation

The Institute is committed to implement the Official Language Act, Policy and rules of Government of India at its HQs and its regional centres located at Noida, Navi Mumbai and Kolkata and MSEC, Noida. The Institute made all sincere efforts to propagate Hindi as an Official Language and has striven to achieve the targets set by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India, New Delhi by organizing various programmes to promote usage of Hindi in the Office work.

#### 1. Compliance of the rules:

The Annual Programme 2023-24 was discussed in the meeting of OLIC of the Institute and was circulated among all the departments. Every effort was made to achieve the targets set in the Annual Programme. The letters received in Hindi were replied to in Hindi only, and all the documents that come under Section 3(3) of the OL Act, viz., general orders, memoranda, etc., were issued bilingually. The letters originating to the offices located in region A, B, and central government offices in region C were sent in bilingual.



## 2. Hindi Workshops:

Hindi workshops were organized during the year in order to acquaint the staff with the Official Languages Act, 1963, Official Language Rules, 1976. Keeping in view the Covid situation, online workshops were conducted during the year. The staff members of the Institute benefited through these workshops.

## 3. Official Language Implementation Committee:

The Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samithi of the Institute consists of members of all the Departments and sections of the Institute. The Deputy Director (Admn.), who is the Hindi Implementation Officer, is the Chairperson of the Committee, and the Hindi staff are Member-Convenors. The committee met quarterly to discuss various issues relating to the implementation of the Official Language and steps to be taken to propagate Hindi as an Official Language. The Hindi staff also attended meetings of Town Official Language Implementation Committee.

## 4. Training

As per the orders of Govt. of India, the staff members are sent for training in Hindi language, typing and stenography to the Central Hindi Teaching Scheme.

## 5. Hindi Fortnight celebrations

To propagate and encourage the staff members to work in Hindi, Hindi Fortnight was celebrated in the Institute from 14-29 September 2023. During the celebrations, the staff were acquainted with various rules of the official language. In order to motivate the staff to work in Hindi and understand the simplicity of the language, the following competitions were organized for the staff and students of the Institute.

## Chapter 20

### Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, (Divyangjan) Nellore

NIEPID had established Composite Regional Centre at Nellore, Andhra Pradesh which has been functioning from 3rd January, 2016. CRC is an extended arm of National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (Divyangjan) formerly NIMH, under the administrative control of Department of Empowerment Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India. All the therapeutic and rehabilitation services are being provided to PWDs since day one. The team consisting of Medical professionals, Psychologists, Special Educators, Therapeutic Experts (Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physiotherapy), Early Interventionists, Orientation & Mobility Instructors, Prosthetic & Orthotic Engineers, Vocational Trainers and Rehabilitation Officers provide services to the PwDs.

## Chapter 21

### Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, (Divyangjan) Davanagere

Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, (Divyangjan) Davanagere was established on 13th February 2017. CRC Davanagere functions under the administrative control of the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID), Secunderabad, with the main objective of creating resources and infrastructure required for developing services for persons with disabilities in the State of Karnataka. The centre strives to empower Persons with Disabilities to realize their fullest potential and participate equally in all aspects of life.

**Services Provided:** CRC Davanagere provides special education services, physiotherapy services, occupational therapy services, audiology & speech pathology services, orthotic & prosthetic services, vocational training, orientation and mobility training, psychological services, social work & placement support and other rehabilitation services, including distribution of assistive devices like hearing aid, teaching-learning materials, smart phones etc., to the persons with disabilities. CRC also conducts several training programs for parents/caretakers of persons with disabilities, rehabilitation professionals and other functionaries rendering services to persons with disabilities.

## Chapter 22

### **Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, (Divyangjan) Rajnandgaon**

The Composite Regional Centre, Rajnandgaon, is an extension of the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID) Secunderabad. It was established on 25th June 2016 to extend services that cater to multiple and diverse disabilities under one roof. The administrative control of the centre was transferred to NIEPID w.e.f 1st May 2020. It is fully equipped and functional to provide rehabilitative and educational services to all types of disabilities. It is located at Old Hospital Campus Rajnandgaon. CRC offers end-to-end solutions for the Divyangjan in Chhattisgarh. Its services range from academic to clinical; it continues to be committed for the cause of the Divyangjan.

Persons having different disabilities, served by CRC, include persons with Locomotor Disability, Blindness, Low-vision, Hearing Impairment, Intellectual Disability, Mental Illness, Leprosy Cured, Cerebral Palsy, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and Multiple Disabled of all ages. Particular emphasis is given to early intervention. A team including Assistant Professor (Speech & Audiology), Assistant Professor (Clinical Psychology), Assistant Professor (Special Education), Lecturer in Occupational Therapy, Lecturer in Physiotherapy, Orientation & Mobility Instructor, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Specialist, Prosthetic & Orthotic Engineer, Rehabilitation Officer, Special Educationist, and Vocational Instructor work at the centre on principles of trans-disciplinary approach.

#### **Aims & Objectives**

- Manpower Development- Long-Term, Short-term courses, Training for rehabilitation personnel such as ANM, Anganwadi, Nurse, Multipurpose Rehabilitation Therapists & other personnel for the rehabilitation of Divyangjans.
- Vocational Training, placement & rehabilitation of Divyangjans.

## Chapter 23

### Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016

The enactment of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (RPwD Act 2016) fulfils the obligations to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), to which India is a signatory. The Act came into force in December 2016. This Act replaces the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995. It emphasizes implementing principles such as respect for inherent dignity, individual autonomy, including the freedom to make one's own choices and the independence of persons. The act lays stress on non-discrimination, complete and adequate participation and inclusion in society, respect for difference and acceptance of disabilities as part of human diversity and humanity, equality of opportunity, accessibility, equality between men and women, respect for the evolving capacities of children with disabilities, and respect for the right of children with disabilities to preserve their identities.

The Act comprising the following 17 chapters is annexed with a Schedule that details various types of Disabilities covered under the Act.

Chapter 1: Preliminary – Discusses definitions

Chapter 2: Rights and entitlements of PWDs

Chapter 3: Education of PWDs

Chapter 4: Skill Development and Employment

Chapter 5: Social security, health, rehabilitation and recreation

Chapter 6: Special provisions for persons with benchmark disabilities

Chapter 7: Special provisions for persons with disabilities with high support needs

Chapter 8: Duties and responsibilities of appropriate governments

Chapter 9: Registration of institutions for persons with disabilities and grants to such institutions

Chapter 10: Certification of specified disabilities

Chapter 11: Central and state advisory boards on disability and district level committees

Chapter 12: Chief Commissioner and state commissioner for persons with disabilities

Chapter 13: Special Court

Chapter 14: National Fund for PWDs

Chapter 15: State fund for PWDs

Chapter 16: Offences and penalties

Chapter 17: Miscellaneous – discussing on power to remove difficulties, power to amend the schedule, power of central government to make rules, etc.,

The types of disabilities covered have been increased from 7 to 21. In addition, the Central Government may notify any other category. Persons with “benchmark disabilities” are defined as those to have at least 40 per cent of the disabilities specified below in

### **INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY**

The nomenclature of mental retardation is replaced by intellectual disability and is defined in the act as:

Intellectual Disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem-solving) and in adaptive behaviour, which covers a range of everyday, social and practical skills, including,

- “specific learning disabilities” means a heterogeneous group of conditions where there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and development aphasia;
- “autism spectrum disorder” means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person’s ability to communicate, understand relationships, and relate to others and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

### **RIGHTS AND ENTITLEMENTS**

The Rights and Entitlements provides that it is the responsibility of the appropriate government to take adequate measures to ensure that the

- persons with disabilities, including women and children, enjoy their rights equally with others,
- enjoy the community life,
- protect the PWDs from cruelty and inhuman treatment, abuse, violence and exploitation,
- ensure protection and safety,



- provide home and family as required,
- ensure reproductive rights,
- accessibility to voting, justice,
- enjoy the legal capacities equally with others
- Guardianship by District Court under which there will be joint decision-making between the guardian and person with disability

## Education

The act has recognized the growing need of inclusive education and accessibility. The act directs in section 16, that the appropriate Government and the local authorities shall endeavor that all educational institutions funded or recognized by them provide inclusive education to the children with disabilities and towards that end shall-

- (i) admit students with disabilities without discrimination and provide education and opportunities for sports and recreation activities equally with others;
- (ii) make building, campus and various facilities accessible;
- (iii) provide reasonable accommodation according to the individual's requirements;
- (iv) provide necessary support individualized or otherwise in environments that maximize academic and social development consistent with the goal of full inclusion;
- (v) ensure that the education to persons who are blind or deaf or both is imparted in the most appropriate languages and modes and means of communication;
- (vi) detect specific learning disabilities in children at the earliest and take suitable pedagogical and other measures to overcome them;
- (vii) monitor participation, progress in terms of attainment levels and completion of education in respect of every student with disability;
- (viii) provide transportation facilities to the children with disabilities and also the attendant of the children with disabilities having high support needs.

Further it has also given the following special measures to be taken by the appropriate Government and the local authorities shall take the following measures for the purpose of section 16, namely: —

- (a) to conduct survey of school going children in every five years for identifying children with disabilities, ascertaining their special needs and the extent to which these are being met: Provided that the first survey shall be conducted within a period of two years from the date of commencement of this Act;
- (b) to establish adequate number of teacher training institutions;
- (c) to train and employ teachers, including teachers with disability who are qualified in sign language and Braille and also teachers who are trained in teaching children with intellectual disability;



- (d) to train professionals and staff to support inclusive education at all levels of school education;
- (e) to establish adequate number of resource centres to support educational institutions at all levels of school education;
- (f) to promote the use of appropriate augmentative and alternative modes including means and formats of communication, Braille and sign language to supplement the use of one's own speech to fulfil the daily communication needs of persons with speech, communication or language disabilities and enables them to participate and contribute to their community and society;
- (g) to provide books, other learning materials and appropriate assistive devices to students with benchmark disabilities free of cost up to the age of eighteen years;
- (h) to provide scholarships in appropriate cases to students with benchmark disability;
- (i) to make suitable modifications in the curriculum and examination system to meet the needs of students with disabilities such as extra time for completion of examination paper, facility of scribe or amanuensis, exemption from second and third language courses;

### **Skill Development and Employment**

Under Vocational training and self-employment, the following directions have been given:

- (1) The appropriate Government shall formulate schemes and programmes including provision of loans at concessional rates to facilitate and support employment of persons with disabilities especially for their vocational training and self-employment.
- (2) The schemes and programmes referred to in sub-section (1) shall provide for—
  - (a) inclusion of person with disability in all mainstream formal and non-formal vocational and skill training schemes and programmes;
  - (b) to ensure that a person with disability has adequate support and facilities to avail specific training
  - (c) exclusive skill training programmes for persons with disabilities with active links with the market, for those with developmental, intellectual, multiple disabilities and autism;
  - (d) loans at concessional rates including that of microcredit;
  - (e) marketing the products made by persons with disabilities; and
  - (f) maintenance of disaggregated data on the progress made in the skill training and selfemployment, including persons with disabilities.

### **Special Provisions for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities**

The following additional benefits have been listed down for persons with benchmark disabilities:

- Additional benefits such as reservation in higher education (not less than 5%), government jobs (not less than 4



- %, reservation in allocation of land (5% allotment) etc. have been provided for persons with benchmark disabilities and those with high support needs.
- 5% reservation in all poverty alleviation and various developmental schemes with priority to women with benchmark disabilities.
- Every child with benchmark disability between the age group of 6 and 18 years shall have the right to free education.
- Government funded educational institutions as well as the government recognized institutions will have to provide inclusive education to the children with disabilities.
- For strengthening the Prime Minister's Accessible India Campaign, stress has been given to ensure accessibility in public buildings (both Government and private) in a prescribed time-frame.

### AUTHORITIES

- Broad based Central and State Advisory Boards on Disability are to be set up to serve as apex policy making bodies at the Central and State level
- The CCD and also the State Commissioners have been strengthened who will now act as regulatory bodies and grievance redressal agencies and also monitor implementation of the Act
- District level committees will be constituted by the State Governments
- National and State Fund will be created to provide financial support to PWDs

### PENALTIES FOR OFFENCES

- The Act provides for penalties for offences committed against persons with disabilities and also violation of the provisions of the new law.
- Any person who violates provisions of the Act, or any rule or regulation made under it, shall be punishable with imprisonment up to six months and/ or a fine of Rs 10,000, or both. For any subsequent violation, imprisonment of up to two years and/or a fine of Rs 50,000 to Rs five lakh can be awarded.
- Whoever intentionally insults or intimidates a person with disability, or sexually exploits a woman or child with disability, shall be punishable with imprisonment between six months to five years and fine.
- Special Courts will be designated in each district to handle cases concerning violation of rights of PwDs.

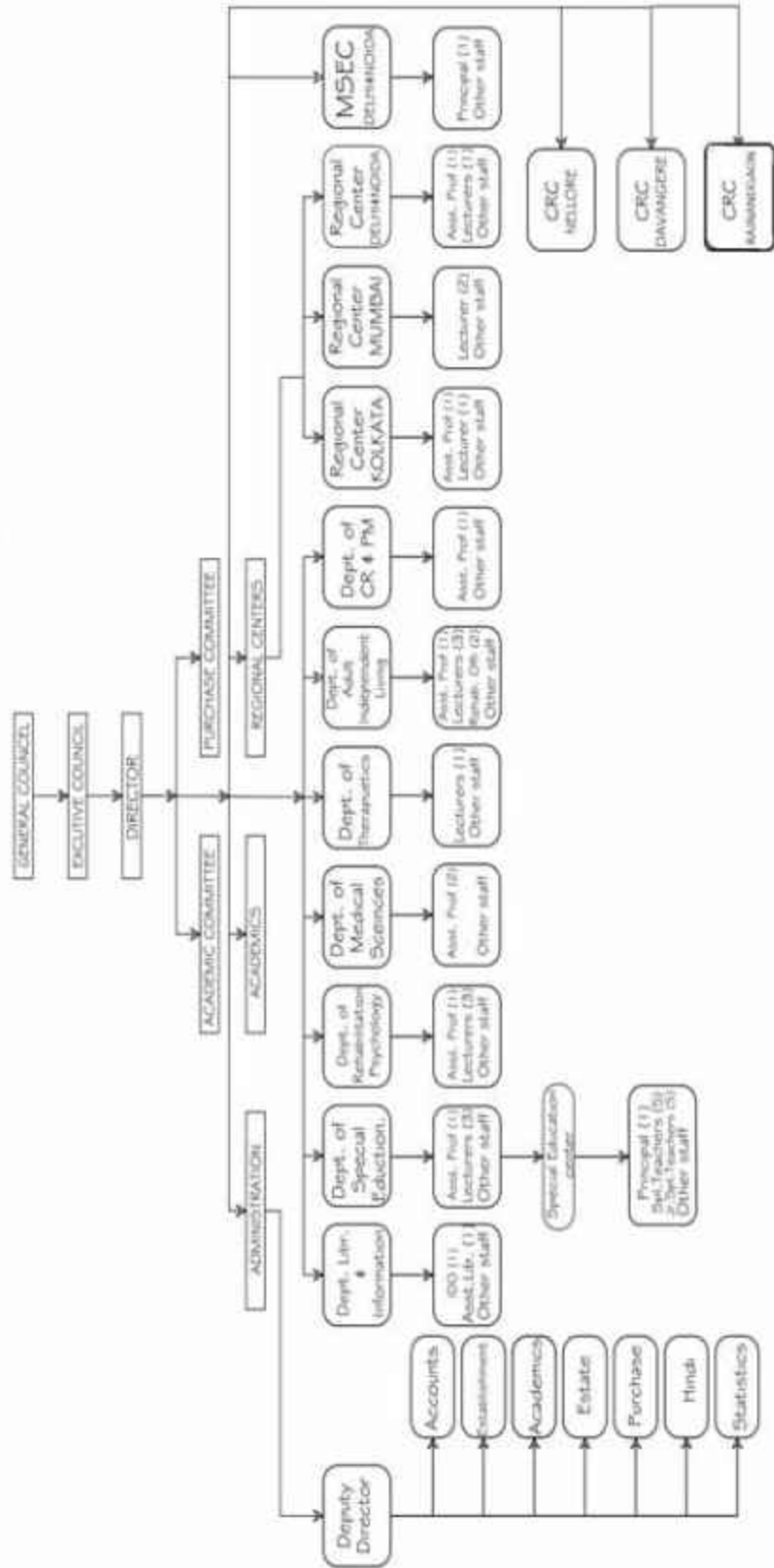

**SEPARATE AUDIT REPORT OF THE COMPTROLLER AND AUDITOR GENERAL ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR THE EMPOWERMENT OF PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES (NIEPID), SECUNDERABAD FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024**

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Institute for the Empowerment of persons with Intellectual Disabilities (Divyangjan) (NIEPID), Secunderabad as at 31 March 2024, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- i. We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment Government of India, New Delhi.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by NIEPID, Hyderabad.

**Comments on Accounts**

**A. Balance Sheet**

**A.1 Corpus/Capital Fund And Liabilities – ₹133.86 crore**

**A.1.1 Corpus/Capital Fund – ₹57.08 crore**

**Reference Number: OBS-1389201**

This includes an expenditure of ₹33,44,107 (₹ 23,82,866 incurred on CPWD maintenance works of Noida and Navi Mumbai and ₹ 9,61,241 towards Noida land lease rent) incurred towards Maintenance works. This amount was utilised from the Capital grants and taken to the Capital Fund. This resulted in overstatement of Capital fund by ₹33.44 lakh and understatement of Expenditure by that extent.

**A.2 Assets – ₹133.86 crore**

**A.2.1 Fixed Assets – ₹73.57 crore**

**Reference Number: OBS-1382083**

**A.2.1.1** This does not include an amount of ₹62,42,916/- incurred towards the work of Renovation/ upgradation works for DAIL building at NIEPID, Bowenpally, Secunderabad. Though the work was completed, the same was shown under Work in Progress instead of capitalising and exhibiting under Fixed Assets.

This resulted in overstatement of Work in Progress and understatement of Fixed assets under Schedule 8 in Balance sheet to an extent of ₹62,42,916/.

**Reference Number: OBS-1383658**

**A.2.1.2** This does include an amount of ₹78,88,725 being the expenditure incurred on completed works as detailed below. Though the works were completed, the same were booked under Work in Progress instead of Fixed Assets. This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets and overstatement of Work in Progress by ₹78,88,725. Further, depreciation is required to be charged on these fixed assets.

## A.2.2 Current Assets, Loans, Advances etc. – ₹44.48 crore

**A.2.2.1** Closing stock of Publications was exhibited as ₹ 89,73,409 instead of ₹ 90,26,965. This resulted in understatement of Current Assets/ Closing stock of Publications to an extent of ₹ 53,556.

## B.1 Expenditure – ₹45.00 crore

**B.1.1.** This includes an amount of ₹50,864 incurred towards the following Fixed Assets procured during the financial year 2023-24. However, the expenditure was treated as a Revenue expenditure instead of capitalising the same.


